STATUTORY AND NATIONAL CONTEXT

The public library service is one of 22 in Wales and 151 across the UK with a legal responsibility to provide a 'comprehensive and efficient' library service in line with the Public Libraries and Museums Act 1964. It is for local Councils to decide how best to do this to meet the needs of their communities; including how may libraries there are, where they are, and how often and how long they are open. In Wales, all public library services report annually to Welsh Government on the Welsh Public Library Standards (WPLS).

DESCRIPTION OF THE SERVICE

The Council operates 18 libraries, along with the LibraryLink and the Digital Service. The total revenue budget for the service in 2024/2025 is £2.9 million together with £0.5 million that supports building costs. There are 4 libraries in larger towns, 3 in smaller towns and 11 community libraries.

Investment in buildings has been primarily through Welsh Government grant funding, match-funded by the Council. The Council has been successful in the last ten years in accessing significant funding for our town libraries at Caerphilly, Risca and Rhymney. The most recent grant investment was in the Rhymney Library Hub which opened in January 2024. Recognising libraries are part of the important fabric of our communities the Council has recently taken a business decision to purchase the Risca Palace Cinema building that houses the library




Current Library Estate

HOW PEOPLE USE LIBRARIES

The top 5 reasons people visit are to:

1. Borrow and return books

- 2. Ask library staff for help and advice
- 3. Attend organised events
- 4. Use the children's library
- 5. Use self-service book issue, return and renew

We know that:

- 62% of our users travel to our libraries by either private or public transport
- 38% of people arrive on foot
- Around 34% of books borrowed are from the children's section
- Just under 60% of people have been using their most favoured library for over 3 years
- 45% of respondents to our most recent survey use the library several times a month
- Users spent around 27,000 hours on our public computers at libraries in 2023/2024. On average an individual will spend around 30 minutes using a public computer during a session. Users also connect to free Wi-Fi using their own devices

Digital Service

Use of the digital collection is increasing. This is a growing area of demand with minimal publicity to date. Comparing data shows us that:

eAudio book loans have increased by 33%	eMagazine loans have increased by 41%
eBook loans have increased by 16%	ePress Newspapers have increased by 48%

LibraryLink

This service is available to residents aged over 70, living within sheltered accommodation/residential care, or are medically unable to attend libraries

Library Outreach

The service visits schools, playgroups, residential homes and community centres and, at some settings, small collections of books are provided.

Order and Collect

An ordering and reservation service can be used to place reservations, along with a staff selection service, based on information provided by users on what they would like to read.
