Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol**

1. Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –

at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
(a) a holographic mark, or
(b) an ultraviolet feature.

Mandatory condition: banning of the sale of alcohol below the cost of duty plus VAT

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

“duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

“permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –

$$P=D+(D \times V)$$

Where

P is the permitted price

D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of alcohol, and

V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

“relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –

the holder of the premises licence,

the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

“Value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

- (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price, which would apply on the first day, applies to sales or supplies of alcohol, which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1. All staff/members who serve alcohol will be trained in the prevention of underage sales. All such training will be updated as necessary, for instances when legislation changes, how to deal with difficult customers. The training will be clearly documented and signed and dated by both the trainer and the member of staff receiving it.
2. The documentation will be available for inspection on request by an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable.
3. Activities relating to deliveries shall only take place between (09:00 – 23:00).
4. A Challenge 25 scheme will be adopted in compliance with the age verification condition: Customers who appear to be under 25 years of age will be required to prove their age when purchasing alcohol. Suitable forms of identification will be a passport, 'Pass' card or other identification recognized by the licensing authority in its statement of licensing policy

(b) Publicity materials notifying customers of the operation of the Challenge 25 scheme shall be displayed at the premises, including a Challenge 25 sign of at least A5 size at the entrance to the premises and where practicable at each point of sale
5. The premises licence holder shall require the designated premises supervisor, or in his / her absence other responsible person, to keep an 'incident / refusals' logbook in a bound book in which full details of all incidents are recorded. This shall include details of any refused sales and shall give details of the persons involved, incident description, time and date, actions taken and final outcome of the situation. This shall be completed as soon as possible and, in any case, no later than the close of business on the day of the incident. The time and date when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The logbook is to be kept on the premises at all times and shall be produced to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable when required. All records shall be kept for a period of 12 months
6. Should customers be outside the premises causing congestion on the pavement, loitering and/or causing Anti-Social Behaviour they will be told to move away from the vicinity of the store by the premises supervisor, manager or other competent person.

7. Where a CCTV system is to be installed, extended or replaced, it shall be to an appropriate standard as agreed with the Licensing Authority in consultation with the Police. Where a CCTV system is to be installed, it shall be fully operational by the day the licence is granted.

(ii) The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in good working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place and for a period of two hours afterwards;

(iii) The premises licence holder shall ensure images from the CCTV are retained for a period of 31 days. This image retention period may be reviewed as appropriate by the Licensing Authority;

(iv) The correct time and date will be generated onto both the recording and the real time image screen;

(v) If the CCTV equipment (including any mobile units in use at the premises) breaks down the Premises Licence Holder shall ensure the designated premises supervisor, or in his/her absence other responsible person, verbally informs the Licensing Authority and the Police as soon as is reasonably practicable. This information shall be contemporaneously recorded in the incident report register and shall include the time, date and means this was done and to whom the information was reported. Equipment failures shall be repaired or replaced as soon as is reasonably practicable and without undue delay. The Licensing Authority and the Police shall be informed when faults are rectified;

(vi) The premise licence holder shall ensure that there are trained members of staff available during licensable hours to be able to reproduce and download CCTV images into a removable format at the request of any authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable;

(vii) The system shall also record clear images permitting the identification of individuals.

(viii) There shall be clear signage indicating that CCTV equipment is in use and recording at the premises during operating hours.

8. Rowdy and/or disorderly customers will be asked to leave the premises.

9. Clear notices displayed at entry/exit points where customers leave the premises must instruct them to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.

10. Throughout the hours that the licence operates the designated premise Supervisor or other responsible person employed at the premise will operate

regular patrols in the vicinity of the premises to collect and tidy any litter or refuse which has accumulated from the premise.

11. There shall be no consumption of alcohol beverages purchased from the premises in open containers outside the front of the premises.

12. Licensable area will be well illuminated, entrance and exit clearly visible, no trip hazards, fire equipment and fire blanket in use on-premise
