1. Application

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. **Appendix 2**
- 1.2 The application is for:
 - a) Supply of Alcohol (For consumption both on and off the premises)

10:00 – 00:00 Monday to Sunday

To extend the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol until 01.00hrs the following

day on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Burns Night (January 25th), Valentines Day (14th February), St Patrick's Day (17th March), St George's Day (23rdApril) and the Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays of Bank Holiday weekends.

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve until the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

b) Late Night Refreshments

23:00 – 00:00 Sunday to Thursday 23:00 – 02:00 Friday and Saturday
```

To extend the terminal hour for late night refreshment until 01.00hrs the following day on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Burns Night (January 25th), Valentines Day (14th February), St Patrick's Day (17th March) and St George's Day (23rd April) – where those days fall other than on a Friday or a Saturday.

To extend the terminal hour for late-night refreshment until 01.00hrs the following day on the Sundays and Mondays of Bank Holiday weekends.

From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve until the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

c) Opening hours

10:00 – 00:30 Sunday to Thursday
10:00 – 04:30 Friday and Saturday
```

To extend the terminal hour for the closing of the premises until 01.30hrs the following day on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Burns Night (January 25th), Valentines Day (14th February), St Patrick's Day (17th March) and St George's Day (23rd April) – where those days fall other than on a Friday or Saturday.

To extend the terminal hour for the closing of the premises until 01.30hrs the following day on the Sundays and Mondays of Bank Holiday weekends.

From the end of opening hours on New Year's Eve until the opening hours on New Year's Day.

1.3 Following representations made by the Police, responsible authority, the applicant has agreed to include conditions agreed with the Police. The hours for late night refreshment have been reduced on Friday and Saturday until 02:00am.

On the basis that the reduced hours and agreed conditions are included in the application, the Police have withdrawn their representations. The agreed conditions can be found at Appendix **4.**

2. Representations

- 2.1 Four relevant representations have been received in relation to the application.
- 2.2 The representations oppose the application and are from the Licensing Authority, Responsible Authority, two Resident Associations and a local resident.

3. Policy

Licensing objectives (Chapter Four Page 20 to 35 of the Policy)

- 3.1 The licensing objectives engaged by this application are:
 - a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - b) The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - c) Public Safety

Cumulative Impact Policy Area (Chapter Six- Page 39 to 44 of the Policy)

3.2 The premises are situated in the Camden Town cumulative impact policy area where there is a presumption to refuse all new or variation applications. The presumption is rebuttable.

Hours policy (Chapter Five- Page 36 to 38 of the Policy)

3.3 The hours policy is engaged by this application in relation to the proposed end times or licensable activities. The framework hours are given in the policy as:

On Sales

Monday to Thursday 10:00 until 23:30 Friday and Saturday 10:00 until midnight 11:00 until 22:30

Off Sales

Monday to Saturday 08:00 until 23:00 Sunday 10:00 until 22:30

No sale or supply of alcohol

Monday to Thursday 09:00 until 23:30 Friday and Saturday 09:00 until midnight 09:00 until 22:30

3.4 The times for the framework hours on any given day are not (and should not be regarded as) the "usual" or "normal" working hours for licensable activities in the Borough. Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighbourhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.

Women's Safety (Appendix One – Page 88 to 89 of the Policy)

3.5 The Council has adopted a set of principles that commit our licensed premises to act in a responsible manner, taking all forms of female harassment seriously and set out the practical steps licensed premises can take to support this.

The principles encourage all licensed premises to consider and implement them in the day to day operation of their premises and include:

 - a) Grant the application in full with such conditions on the licence that are consistent with the operating schedule.
 - b) Grant the application subject to revised conditions that they consider appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.
 - c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

- 5.3 Members may attach additional conditions if they consider it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives raised in the representations.
- 5.4 Members are reminded that all applications must be considered on their own merits, and that findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.

6. Conclusion

6.1 Members are required to consider the application in light of all the relevant information, and if approval is given, may attach such conditions appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.
