### Themes

At Eleanor Palmer, we operate a two year cycle of assembly themes. Cycle One encourages children to reflect on themselves and their engagement in the wider world, looking at inspirational figures and events that can help to shape them as global citizens. Cycle Two focuses on our 'life skills' curriculum, developing children's knowledge and understanding of key characteristics that will enable them to grow and succeed in all areas of life. Key events, such as religious holidays, national days and celebrations, are taught and reflected upon each year. Our school rules of 'ready, respectful, safe' are embedded in all that we do.

Alongside our assemblies, we also hold 'Big School Meetings'. This involves every child from Reception to Year 6, who meet in a vertical group with a class teacher. Meetings will have a discussion theme, which may relate to current assembly topics, and are often an opportunity for children to share their views, debate and vote on choices that will impact them. Examples of this include choosing new playground equipment and voting for a charity to fundraise for.
