1. Application

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. **Appendix 2**
- 1.2 The application is for:

a) Supply of Alcohol (For consumption on the premises)

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10:00 - 23:30 - Monday to Thursday
10:00 - 00:00 - Friday to Saturday
11:00 - 22:30 – Sunday
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On a Sunday prior to a Bank Holiday Monday until 00:00.

On New Years Eve the permitted hours for the provision of licensable activities will be extended through to 02:00 on New Years Day.

b) Recorded Music

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23:00 - 23:30 - Monday to Thursday
23:00 - 00:00 - Friday to Saturday
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On a Sunday prior to a Bank Holiday Monday from 23:00 until 00:00.

On New Years Eve the permitted hours for the provision of licensable activities will be extended through to 02:00 on New Years Day.

c) Late Night Refreshment

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23:00 - 23:30 - Monday to Thursday
23:00 - 00:00 - Friday to Saturday
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On a Sunday prior to a Bank Holiday Monday from 23:00 until 00:00.

On New Years Eve the permitted hours for the provision of licensable activities will be extended through to 02:00 on New Years Day.

d) Opening Hours

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08:00 - 00:00 - Monday to Thursday
08:00 - 00:30 - Friday to Saturday
08:00 - 23:00 – Sunday
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On a Sunday prior to a Bank Holiday Monday until 0030 the following morning. On New Years Eve the opening hours will be extended through to 02:30 on New Years Day.

Engagement by the Applicant

1.3 The Council offers a voluntary pre-application process which encourages applicants to engage with responsible authorities and local residents prior to submitting their application.

The applicant did engage with the pre-application process. The application takes account of and reflects responses received during this process

2. Representations

- 3.1 The licensing objectives engaged by this application are:

 - b) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

The premises is situated in the cumulative impact policy area Camden Town, where there is a presumption to refuse all new and variation applications.

Hour's policy (Chapter Five- Page 36 to 38 of the Policy

The hours policy is not engaged by this application in relation to the proposed end times for licensable activities. The framework hours are given in the Policy as:

On Sales

Monday to Thursday 10:00 until 23:30 Friday and Saturday 10:00 until midnight Sunday 11:00 until 22:30

3.2 The times for framework hours on any given day are not (and should not be regarded as) the 'usual' or 'normal' hours for licensable activities in the Borough. Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighbourhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.

- 5.4 Members are reminded that all applications must be considered on their own merits, and that findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.

6. Conclusion

6.1 Members are required to consider the application in light of all the relevant information, and if approval is given, may attach such conditions appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.
