Members should note that the 'spouse or civil partner' requirement applies to all Statutory Disclosable Pecuniary Interests categories. A separate column is provided to allow interests of a spouse/partner to be distinguished from the councillor's.

For the sake of completeness, Members are advised to:

- Show every employment that has to be declared for income tax purposes;
- Give the name of the employer;
- Give the job title/activity;
- Where an office is held give the name of the person/body which made the appointment;
- If you are in a job such as a lawyer or consultant where you may have long-term clients it is worth listing these as they are a key source of your income.

(b) Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit² (other than from Camden Council) made or provided within the last 12 months in respect of any expenses incurred in carrying out duties as a member or towards election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a Trade Union³

This section is where the names of any person/body which has provided payment or other financial benefit in respect of your duties as a councillor or election expenses should be recorded.

Members are advised to state the amount or value of any payment/financial benefit/ expenses received.

This includes expenses paid by a political party and applies to payments made within 12 months prior to you completing this form

Members should be mindful to ensure that they declare fully in relation to the organisations who are assisting them.

'Land' excludes an easement, servitude, interest or right in or over land which does not carry with it a right for you or the other relevant person (alone or jointly with another) to occupy the land or to receive income.

You therefore need to include your home or the home of your spouse/partner that is within Camden whether the interest is as freeholder, leaseholder or tenant. Home addresses will be held on a separate, internal register, with only the ward within which they are situated published, unless you would prefer your full address included.

You should also include any property within Camden from which you or your spouse/partner receive rent or are mortgagees. The Borough Solicitor will consider whether the addresses should be published on a case by case basis.

This is a licence to occupy – a less formal form of landholding, such as an allotment or parking space.

'Beneficial interest' - essentially any shares you would benefit from if sold for profit.

'Securities' means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society.

TO NOTE: a failure to complete the above sections may amount to a criminal offense

This section is where Members list unpaid appointments to outside bodies, including joint committees.

This section is where Members list their unpaid memberships, including where they are in a position of general control or management, such as being a school governor, trusteeships, memberships of clubs and outside organizations, (including for example Rotary, The Lions, Freemasons, Castenians, or similar if they are directed to charitable purposes, the influence of public opinion or policy, or exercise functions of a public nature). There must be some formality to the membership, such as registration for example. Simply attending a meeting such as for a local campaign does not make councillors a 'member' of that organisation'. However, there has been a growth in organisations where no formal membership requirements exist, such as Extinction Rebellion. Members should ask themselves if they consider themselves a member of the organization.

01/10/2012 - Invitation to annual dinner and ball evening; estimated value £100 donated by AN Other Institute

When declaring gifts or hospitality Members need to provide the following information:

- Nature of gift
- Name of donor
- Date received
- Actual/estimated value of gift
