I am a resident	of	, and I have lived at	since 1998.

- 2. I am applying on behalf of a group of 38 residents to review the premises licence of Sican, 26-28 Whitfield Street, London, W1T 2RG ("the Premises") for the reasons set out in the grounds for review. The names of those supporting the application are set out at the end of the grounds for review. In this witness statement I set out in more detail the problems I personally have experienced since October 2023. The other local residents supporting this application have also suffered from the extreme nuisance and disturbance caused by the Premises, and they will provide more detail in their representations in due course once the application has been advertised. I have attached to this statement 7 video clips illustrating the nuisance and disturbance caused by the Premises.
- 3. One of the main sources of the extreme disturbance and noise nuisance are the Premises' so-called 'Bottomless Brunches'. The offer is two hours of unlimited alcohol for £55 per person, and they are available to book until midnight Monday-Friday and until 02:00 on Saturday. I have attached to this statement screenshots from the Premises' website showing the times when bookings are available.
- 4. On 21 March 2024, there was a meeting between residents, staff and a legal representative from the Premises and Camden licensing officers. At the meeting it was agreed that the Premises would put security staff on the door, provide a more visible street presence and actively disperse customers. It was also agreed that a noise limiter would be installed and that the Premises might install another set of doors to reduce noise. The licensing officer from Camden (Esther Jones) stated that they would conduct spot checks to ensure that the Premises was doing what was agreed. Unfortunately,

since this meeting there has been no improvement, and if anything the situation has
become even worse. As there has been no improvement, I and the other local residents
have been left with no option but to apply for a review of the premises licence.

History of Incidents

- 6. On Saturday 28 October 2023 people turned up at the Premises after 23:00 and were let in. There was loud music with DJ's and dancing, and the Premises was operating as a nightclub. I saw eight people arrive at 23:35, and they were told that they could not come in. They argued with the doorman who got someone else to come out and tell them that they could not go in. After this other person arrived, they were all let in.
- 7. On Saturday 11 November 2023 there was loud noise throughout the evening. I went to complain to the door person and asked to see the manager. The manager came out but said that they were was not anything they could do. A woman on her phone told her friends they should come because it was a club in the West End and you did not have to pay to get in. There was shouting and screaming outside, with people sitting on the pavement outside vomiting. Eventually, police attended the Premises after someone was punched.
- 8. On Saturday 25 November 2023 there was extremely loud shouting and screaming in the street after each of the two-hour drinking sessions hosted by the Premises. A young woman was sitting on the pavement edge being sick, and she was so drunk she could not move for over an hour. Door staff eventually tried to help her. Other young women were sick on my neighbour's doorstep and on Whitfield Street.
- On Friday 1 December 2023 customers were standing outside the Premises being extremely loud. This continued after 23:00 when the manager was standing outside just a couple of metres away.
- 10. On Friday 8 December 2023 there was constant loud noise outside the Premises from 22:50 onwards, which kept me awake.
- 11. On Friday 15 December 2023 I saw two men arrive at the Premises at 01:05 and walk straight in without being stopped by door staff. I took a photograph and was harassed by one of the Premises' customers who followed me down the street shouting at me.

- 12. On Friday 22 December 2023 there was extremely loud noise from customers outside the Premises and along Whitfield Street, where groups of customers from the Premises were standing. The customers were extremely loud from 23:00-00:45.
- 13. On Friday 29 December 2023 there was loud noise from the Premises from 10:30-01:00. I was woken up at 12:20, and the noise was so loud that I went to see what was happening. Four young women were sitting on the road side outside the Premises, so drunk that a couple of them could not stand. They were then joined by a man, and they were all shouting at each other. I asked the doorman if he could ask the customers to be quiet, and he responded that they were not their customers. The man then started shouting at me in an intimidating way. I tuned to walk back towards Colville Place, and the aggressive man shouted abuse at me. The man followed me, and the doorman did nothing to stop him. The man grabbed me and pushed me into a fence, and I was extremely seared. I called to the doorman to come and get his customer off me. The doorman came over and rather than doing anything to get the man off me began to ask me questions. I was in shock and thought I was about to be beaten up so I do not remember exactly what he said, but he was trying to blame me for the customer's attack. I shouted for someone to ring the police, and my wife ran out of our house and was shocked to see the situation. Eventually two staff from the Premises came out and rushed over to help me, and they struggled to remove the man from me while the doorman stood there just filming everything.
- 14. The Premises' dispersal policy is just to push customers away from their property and then deny that they are their customers. This means that customers are allowed to stay outside on the street, shouting and screaming and causing a huge amount of disturbance. I have mentioned this incident to a number of local residents, and a couple have told me that they are also intimidated by the Premises' customers. Many are too scared to do anything, especially given the management's attitude.
- 15. On Saturday 6 January 2024 there was loud noise from customers outside the Premises after one of their bottomless two hour drinking sessions started at approximately 17:30. At 19:55 the noise started again, as the next group came out of the Premises after their 2-hour bottomless drinking session. This time the extremely loud noise continued for an hour.

- 16. On Friday 12 January 2024 loud noise from customers outside the Premises started at approximately 22:30. This continued and by 23:20 there were many aggressive customers from the Premises shouting loudly on Whitfield Street. It was so loud and sounded like a massive fight, so I and my wife were too afraid to leave our home. There was no door staff, and no-one from the Premises attempted to stop the aggressive and loud behaviour of customers once they were outside.
- 17. On Saturday 27 January 2024 there was loud shouting from customers outside the Premises. By 17:50 it had become unbearable, and I went to see what was happening. There were about 20-30 Sican customers along the pavement either side of the Premises and also a group of about 10 on the other side of the road, I took a few photographs and one of the staff ran inside the Premises and came out with a man in a suit. I told the man that the noise was excessive and asked him to stop it. The man ignored this and asked me to come inside to see the club and bar. I said that I did not want to, and the problem was what was happening outside. I was not the only resident there complaining about the noise, but the man was joined by someone else and they both started to behave in a very intimidating manner. Nobody did anything and the loud noise continued for another hour.
- 18. The loud noise then stopped but then started again when the next group of drunken customers left when their 2-hour bottomless drinking session ended. The noise started again at 23:00 and continued until very late. No-one from the Premises makes any effort to stop the disturbance caused to local residents from customers outside the Premises. Door staff just ask people to move slightly away down the street, and they continue shouting and waking everyone up.
- 19. On Saturday 3 February 2024 there was loud noise again after each two-hour bottomless drinking session and then from 23:20 onwards. There was no effort to stop this happening from the Premises.
- 20. On Saturday 24 February I saw the Premises admit several new customers after 00:10.
- 21. On Saturday 2 March 2024 there was loud noise from the Premises from 3pm when every two hours large groups of people were discharged from the Premises. Customers are not allowed to go back inside the Premises and are instead told by door staff to go to Colville Place to urinate.

- 22. On Sunday 3 March 2024 there was loud customer noise from 22:30. From 23:10 especially there was a huge amount of noise, which turned into a street fight with customers vomiting and urinating on Colville Place. The excessive noise continued until after midnight. Police attended the Premises.
- 23. On Saturday 16 March 2024 several people reported anti-social behaviour such as fights and bottles being thrown.
- 24. On Saturday 30 March 2024 a loud altercation started at approximately 00:20 which lasted for at least 30 minutes, with drunken customers leaving the Premises screaming and shouting. No attempt was made by the Premises to control this. Many residents were woken up and complained. This was 9 days after the meeting where the Premises said that this would no longer happen.
- 25. On Saturday 13 April 2024 more disturbance was caused by drunken customers leaving the Premises. There was very loud shouting from drunken customers from 15:00 and then again at 17:25. Customers continued to urinate on Colville Place and be sick on residents' doorsteps.
- 26. On Saturday 20 April and Sunday 21 April 2024 there was loud shouting from 17:30 after each bottomless drinking session ended. When one resident confronted the door staff he was told that there were too many of them to control.
- 27. On Sunday 28 April 2024 at 01:30 I was woken by a large volume of loud noise, as all the customers were leaving the Premises.
- 28. On Saturday 4 May 2024 there was very loud noise at 20:20. Approximately thirty customers from the Premises were shouting across the street at each other. No staff from the Premises made any attempt to stop this. The loud noise continued for approximately 25 minutes. I went to talk to staff, and I told the manager that this noise was unacceptable and that they needed to stop it. The Premises was unable to do so as there were so many people. It was completely uncontrollable.
- 29. On Sunday 5 May 2024 I was woken up by the shouting and screaming at 01:20 which had continued from the night before. The manager and door staff were outside the Premises smoking while all the customers making noise were on the other side of Whitfield Street, continuing to shout and wake everyone up. I asked the manager why

- 30. he was not trying to stop the noise, and he just shrugged his shoulders. Neither made any effort to stop the noise, and the door person said that they could not as it was dangerous to confront their customers. Later on the same day at 19:30 there was very loud shouting as customers exited the Premises after their 2 hour bottomless drinking session and stood on Whitfield Street. There were no door staff on duty to stop the antisocial behaviour.
- 31. On Friday 17 May 2024 there were no door staff outside at any time. There was loud noise all evening from customers of the Premises, which became extremely loud after 23:00. Noise complaints were made by several residents due to the noise caused by uncontrollable drunken people.
- 32. On Saturday 29 June 2024 there was loud noise outside the Premises from 11:30-00:50. At 00:30 the noise was so loud that I went to see what was happening. It looked as if staff from the Premises had just moved all their customers to the other side of Whitfield Street. There was not a single door person on duty. Customers were shouting and loud music was playing from their cars. The noise continued and at 01:10 there were women urinating outside our house on the pavement. I went out, and a door person was sitting outside the Premises. I asked her about the large crowd that was very loud, and she responded that 'there's 50 of them and one of me, I'm not willing to get a punch in the face.' I asked the group to move and some of them moved away. The rest continued making loud noise until 01:30.
- 33. On 5-6 July 2024 there was extremely loud shouting and screaming from the Premises' customers from 12:50-02:00. I went outside to take photographs, and the manager sitting outside the Premises saw me. Instead of asking the large groups of drunk customers to be quiet, he started filming me and the customers began to shout abuse at me. Other residents have told me that the management has also tried to intimidate them.
- 34. On 11-13 July 2024 there was loud shouting and screaming from 23:30 until after 01:30. There was no door staff or anyone from the Premises outside on Thursday and Friday. On Saturday I went out to ask the door person to ask their customers to be quiet and was told that they were too many. This was the second time I had been told this by two different door staff members.

- 35. On 19-20 July 2024 there was constant loud noise from the Premises from 22:30 until after 01:00. It was the hottest day and night of the year, and I had to close my windows due to the noise from the Premises' customers. It was still so loud that I was being constantly woken up and had to use earplugs. Even wearing earplugs and with my double-glazed windows closed I was still woken up several times.
- 36. On 21-22 July 2024 there was a large group outside the front of the Premises, with no door staff present. The large group were all holding alcoholic drinks and were completely blocking the footpath and creating lots of noise. There was again very loud noise late at night and into the early morning.
- 37. On 26-27 July 2024 the noise was terrible, with extremely loud noise coming from customers outside the Premises. The noise started at 23:30 and around 01:00 it became a street party, with loud music blaring out of cars and customers from the Premises partying and dancing in the middle of Whitfield Street. I went outside at 01:10 to witness this, and the manager was standing outside, doing nothing to stop this. There were no door staff. When the manager saw me, he went inside and shut the door. One of the drunken people dancing started to shout at me not to take photos and then came at me, telling me to give her my phone. I refused. She started arguing with me, so I turned to walk home, which is when she called for some men to join her. I headed back to my house, but the men then ran after me. I ran quickly to my house and got inside as they reached the front door and tried to stop me closing it.
- 38. I called 999 and reported this to the Police. I was completely shaken by this aggressive behaviour from drunken customers. The street party continued until 02:45. The next morning I learnt that several of my neighbours had been woken by the noise and went to complain to the manager from 23:30 onwards. Each person was told to go home, and one woman also said that the customers had behaved aggressively towards her as well.
- 39. Following this incident I was away on holiday for a month.
- 40. On 24-25 August 2024, once I had returned from holiday there was once again extremely loud shouting from customers leaving the Premises after their bottomless drinking session. The noise on Sunday was so loud that it woke me and my children. The shouting, screaming and loud noise from in and around a parked car continued for some time. I went outside to look, and the manager was outside with another member of

- staff not doing anything. Customers were dancing in the road and along Whitfield Street.
- 41. On 25 August 2024 the music coming out of the Premises was so loud that it was disturbing me in my home, which is approximately 80m away. I went to see what was happening, and the doors were wide open and everyone inside was being hyped up by the DJ.
- 42. On 6-7 September 2024 there was again loud music escaping from the Premises due to the doors being open all day. Whitfield Street was full of drunken and extremely loud customers from the Premises shouting and screaming from 21:00 until 02:00.
- 43. On 13-15 September 2024 there was the usual loud noise from customers from the Premises, starting in the afternoon and continuing every 2-2.5hrs when each 2-hour bottomless drinking session finished. The noise from shouting and screaming customers was pretty much continuous from 23:30 until 01:30.
- 44. On 20-22 September 2024 there was again the usual loud noise from customers from the Premises after they had finished their bottomless drinking sessions. On Saturday afternoon after the 15:00 drinking session the noise was so loud that I and several other residents went to see what was happening. We discovered a group of very drunk customers gathered around 1 Colville Place, with some urinating against the fence of Crabtree Fields. Two of the group were drinking from bottles of wine and prosecco, and others had glass glasses full of wine. When a staff member from the Premises saw us, the manager suddenly came over and tried to break up the disturbance. Staff asked a customer to give him the bottle of prosecco, but the customer refused and tried to empty the bottle by drinking swiftly from the bottle. The noise later that day between 00:00 and 01:30 was also unbearable, with residents complaining to each other the next day.
- 45. On Saturday 5 October there was the usual extreme noise after every 2 hour bottomless drinking session. I returned home at about 23:50 after meeting a friend. The noise from customers on Whitfield Street outside the Premises was extremely loud. I went outside again at 01:00 as the noise was so loud and saw three people standing outside taking photos before they went back inside just after 01:00. When I took my friend to get a taxi home just after 02:00, I could see that door staff were on duty outside, past the Premises' closing time.

- 46. On Thursday 10 October loud noise and music from the Premises started at around 21:30. At 22:30 the loud noise was still going on, a neighbour informed me that they went there to complain, where they could see customers from the Premises outside and the doors wide open. There were approximately fifteen people running about outside, all so intoxicated that they did not see my neighbour. My neighbour tried to find any management, but no-one was there and there was no door staff. They went inside to seek out a manager, it was a nightclub inside and not a restaurant, with two DJs and no-one eating.
- 47. On Friday 11 October I and my family were woken up by loud shouting at 01:30. A group of young women were shouting outside my house towards friends that were on Whitfield Street, near the Premises. I am sure they were customers from the Premises because this type of anti-social behaviour never happened before the Premises opened. The young women then urinated in front of my house on the footpath.

SICAN, 26-28 WHITFIELD STREET, LONDON W1T 2RG GROUNDS FOR REVIEW

Introduction

- 1. I am applying on behalf of 38 residents who live on Colville Place, Whitfield St and Crabtree Place to review the premises licence of Sican, 26-28 Whitfield Street, London W1T 2RG ("the Premises") on the grounds that the operation of the Premises undermines the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder, public safety and preventing public nuisance. The names of the 38 residents supporting this application are listed at the end.
- 2. In summary, the Premises operates as a drinking venue that sponsors irresponsible drinks promotions and fails to manage or disperse its drunk customers, who cause extreme public nuisance by shouting, screaming and fighting on Whitfield Street into the early hours of the morning. The customers of the Premises are completely out of control and have made it impossible to live in what was once a quiet residential area. We do not oppose the presence of a suitably conditioned premises licence that is run in a responsible way, but the operation must be controlled to achieve the right balance and to ensure that the Premises promotes the licensing objectives.
- 3. I and other local residents have made complaints to the Council and the Police, and we have also tried to engage directly with the premises licence holder. None of these complaints have made any difference, and the problems associated with the Premises have persisted since the summer of 2023, when the Premises stopped operating as a restaurant. We have been left with no option but to apply for a review of the premises licence. Our right to enjoyment of our homes has been shattered. We have been supported by the Council and the Police in taking this action.
- 4. These grounds of review are supported by my witness statement, which includes videos taken of the noise and disturbance caused by the Premises. Four main issues are addressed below before proposed conditions are set out.

Operation of the Premises

5. The Premises operates as a drinking venue that sponsors irresponsible drinks promotions, namely a 'Bottomless Brunch' where there is unlimited alcohol available for each person for two hours for £55 per person. Despite the reference to 'Brunch', it is possible to book this drinks promotion until midnight Monday-Friday and until 02:00 on Saturday. There are multiple bookings at the weekend, and live entertainment in the form of DJs and 'fire shows' are also provided. As the booking is for a two-hour slot and all customers arrive and leave at the same time, every two hours approximately fifty drunk customers all leave at the same time, causing a huge amount of noise and disturbance each time. They then proceed to shout, scream, urinate, vomit and sometimes fight with each other while door staff from the Premises look on without doing anything.

Terminal Hour

6. The extreme disturbance caused by the Premises often lasts until the early hours of the morning, often past 01:00 and sometimes past 02:00. I and other residents have been woken up multiple times in the past year by the noise generated by the Premises and its drunk customers. Families are leaving what was previously a quiet enclave in Fitzrovia, as the Premises' operations have turned the neighbourhood at the weekend into an impossible place to live.

Dispersal

7. Customers who leave the Premises in a large group linger in the area, shouting, screaming, vomiting and urinating nearby. The Premises takes no action to disperse customers or control their behaviour, at best just asking customers to move slightly down the street away from the Premises. The noise caused by these aggressive and drunk customers outside the Premises is unbearable.

Attitude of the Licence Holder

8. Local residents have consistently reported issues with the Premises over the past year. We understand that the Council's licensing officers and the Police have both asked the Premises to make operational changes, but this has made no difference. The licence holder has no interest in understanding residents' concerns or taking positive action to address them. Rather, security staff have said that they are afraid to intervene given how out of control the customers are, or the security staff have instead behaved aggressively towards residents attempting to document what has been happening. This has made it necessary to apply for a review of the premises licence.

Proposed Conditions

- 9. The current premises licence has very few conditions and is not promoting the licensing objectives. In order to address the serious problems summarised above, which are having a devastating effect on the lives of local residents, the following amendments should be made to the premises licence:
 - a) Reduction of opening hours to framework hours. The off sale of alcohol to cease at 23:00, and the on sale of alcohol to cease half an hour before closing to allow for 'drinking up' time. These hours are extended from the start of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day. Deletion of conditions 15-17 and 21.
 - b) Removal of Recorded Music as a licensable activity from the licence to prevent performances by live DJ's. Deletion of condition 18.
 - c) Deletion of condition 20.
 - d) Addition of the following conditions:
 - i) There shall be no 'Bottomless Brunch' or any other drinks promotion where unlimited alcohol is provided.
 - ii) No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
 - iii) The premises shall only operate as a restaurant,
 - i) in which customers are shown to their table or the customer will select a table themselves,
 - ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table,
 - iv) which do not provide any takeaway service of food or drink for immediate consumption off the premises,
 - v) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons in ancillary to taking such meals.

For the purpose of this condition 'Substantial Table Meal' means- a meal as might be expected to be served as the main midday or main evening meal, or as a main course at either such meal and is eaten by a person seated at a table, or at a counter or other structure which serves the purposes of a table and is not used for the service of refreshments for consumption by persons not seated at a table or structure servicing the purposes of a table.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

Notwithstanding this condition, alcohol may be supplied and consumed prior to a meal in the bar area in the basement, by up to a maximum at any one time, of 18 persons dining at the premises.

- iv) No alcoholic beverages or glass containers shall be taken outside the premises by customers at any time.
- v) Alcoholic beverages can only be sold to and consumed by customers outside the premises when sat at a table covered by a tables and chairs licence where required.
- vi) Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke or make a phone call, shall be limited to four persons at any one time.
- vii) The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are properly supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- viii) The premises licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by door staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction to the public highway.
- ix) Notices shall be prominently displayed at each exit from the premises asking customers to be considerate to neighbours when leaving.
- x) Notices shall be prominently displayed at each exit from the premises asking patrons smoking to be considerate to neighbours.
- xi) All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by 22:00 hours each day.

- xii) A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognized photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- xiii) The premises shall operate a dispersal policy which shall contain as a minimum information about dispersing customers away from Whitfield Street and towards Goodge Street, including waiting for taxis on Goodge Street rather than Whitfield Street. All staff shall be trained in the implementation of the dispersal policy, and a copy of the dispersal policy shall be made readily available at the premises for inspection by a police officer and/or an authorized officer of Camden Council.
- xiv) During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- xv) All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- xvi) A minimum of one door supervisor shall be on duty on the premises during the hours of 7pm until 30 minutes after close on Thursdays-Sundays to manage customers outside the premises and to assist with dispersal.





- Monday to Saturday 0800 hours until 2300 hours
- Sunday 1000 hours until 2230 hours

Cumulative Impact Areas

The premises is not situated within any of the two cumulative impact area, as it is in Bloomsbury Ward.

Complaint History

The premises has had numerous complaints made against it from residents to Noise and Licensing officers and also to the Police.

Conclusion

The Licensing Authority is supporting the review of the premises licence and asking for the application for a review to be granted in line with resident's request in its entirety for the following reasons:-

The premises has been the source of numerous complaints from several residents to the Licensing Authority. The Licensing Authority did it's best to engage with the premises, writing to the premises on 22nd November 2023 inviting them for an engagement meeting on the 13th of December 2023. A copy of the invite letter forms part of this representation.

After the meeting at the council offices, a letter was sent to the premises on 13th December 2023 detailing what was discussed and promises made by the premises, a copy of the letter forms part of my representation.

As the Licensing Authority continued to receive complaints from residents about the manner in which the premises is being operated being a source of disturbance to them, on 10th December 2023 the Licensing Authority and the licensing police carried out a joint visit to the venue during out of hours and witnessed first-hand music being played from the premises and noise from visitors leaving the premises emanating from the venue. This appear to justify residents' several emails complaining to us about the venue. A copy of the email sent the management team forms part of my representation.

We also witnessed during the visit referred to above, anti-social behaviour from guests to the venue, e.g. shouting and screaming in the middle of the street, going in both directions on the street and including a (female) leaving and urinating against a car parked on the street a couple of yards away from where the police and I were standing.

A copy of the letter sent to the venue inviting their management for a constructive, engagement meeting after the above visit forms part of my representation.

On 21st March 2024 both Licensing and Noise Team Leaders visited the venue to meet with residents, the management team of the venue and the legal representative of the premises, Marcus Lavell to discuss ways the premises can operate without engaging with any of the 4 licensing objectives and in harmony with residents. After the meeting we i.e. their legal rep, members of the management of the premises, and council officers, then met indoors with the premises management on the lower ground floor. Observations made during the meeting at the site which included mice at least 4 of them chasing themselves round the banquet seats opposite where we were sat (which had torn covers and exposed foam) carpets on the stairs which were visibly, heavily matted with grime and were drawn to their attention and that of their legal rep, such that in large parts of the carpet leading to the lower ground floor, neither the colour nor the pattern were discernible.

All of these were drawn to their attention, and we asked if the premises was even registered with the council's food safety officers in the first instance. I informed them that I have no option but to inform my colleagues in Pest Control and Food safety of our observations.

On 22nd March 2024 a letter was sent to the premises via email and copied to both Pest Control and Food Safety, detailing our findings and what was agreed at the meeting with the residents and the premises on 21st March. A copy of the letter and the email form part of this representation.

On 7th May 2024 a second letter was sent to the premises inviting them to a meeting at the council offices on 30th May 2024 following receipt of further complaints from residents subsequent to the meeting of 22nd March 2024. On 14th May we met with a representative of the residents to advise them on the way forward in line with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003

On Friday 23rd August 2024 police and licensing officers visited the premises during joint out of hours visit, where we found several rubbish bags outside the premises by the scaffolding next to the premises, such that the public pathway was not available for use by anybody else, as it was completely blocked by several refuse sacks from the premises. We drew the attention of the premises to this fact which they did not deny the bags were from their premises, we requested that the premises arrange to have these removed immediately if I should make a return visit and find the situation unresolved or I would bring a review under Prevention of Public Nuisance as residents had complained about this in the past. (Their refuse collector's firm name was on all the bags) They apologised and informed us that their refuse collector has promised to ensure these bags are removed. In this instance, it was clear that these refuse bags were not surreptitiously dumped as the premises had stated have happened in the past. On Saturday 24th August I carried out an unannounced visit to the premises and observed that the whole area had been cleared and the public pathway was again available for use.

On October 23rd Food safety officers carried out an inspection of the premises their rating of the business led to a voluntary closure of the business, findings by food safety officers proved conclusively that despite the premises being informed in the presence of their legal rep of the presence of mice infestation, it would appear they had not take

adequate remedial action to eradicate this and to ensure that the infestation was kept at bay. A copy of the report regarding the infestation forms part of my report.

The licensing authority would like to further add that the premises be shut for a period not less than one (Calendar) month to allow it to treat any infestation it may have, carry out a deep clean up the premises, revamp its operations and put into place measures that would ensure that: -

Its operation does not engage with any of the 4 licensing objectives.

Its clients should not constitute themselves as nuisance to residents in neighbouring premises.

Waste/Refuse from their premises is managed such that it does not constitute a public nuisance nor lead to pest infestation either within their premises or other premises.

That music from the premises is not a source of disturbance to residence and does not constitute a nuisance in public space. i.e. the street.

That adequate arrangement is in place for taxis/cabs picking up clients from their venue such that this operation is a source of disturbance to residents in neighbouring premises.

For a while, the premises appear to be endeavouring to work with the licensing authority in that it did produce dispersal policy and communicated with us regularly, regarding actions they are taking to manage the premises better, however, this did not stop the flow of complaints from residents. Hence, when the review was received the Licensing Authority was not surprised.

Thank you for attending our offices today for a meeting with licensing and Environmental Health, following our invitation to your premises which was as a result of complaints from residents about noise and anti-social behaviour from visitors to your premises when they depart your venue and as witnessed by myself and two police officers when we visited your premises on Saturday the 9th of December 2023 at around your closing hours.

You were supported at this meeting from by some of your staff and a consultant Dr. M. Harshi. At that meeting, we informed you that we observed the following during our visit to our premises: -

- Antisocial behaviour from visitors (mainly women) who were going up and down
 Whitfield Street waiting for their taxis, gathering in small and or large groups to
 talk and shout at the top of their voices.
- Music emanating from your premises, intermittently when the door was opened to let people out.
- A lone female door supervisor who was clearly overwhelmed by the number of people leaving the premises and the fact that they were moving in different directions and was clearly being ignored.

In our opinion, the complaints made, based on what we found when we visited was justified and you have promised to look into this.

- You assured the meeting that you have taken cognisance of our comments and have even begun to put into place steps that would address our concerns.
- You said you have a draft dispersal policy ready for our consideration, but we asked that this be provided to our pollution team on completion.
- That you would look into increasing the number of security staff outside the venue at close of business to facilitate dispersal
- You were advised by Environmental Health to consider liaising/meeting with your neighbours via a letter to them to reassure them that you are listening to their concerns and provide contact details for them. You said you would look into this as well.
- You were also asked to consider a double door for the front door to reduce the incident of noise break out when the door is opened to let people out.

It is hoped that the measures you, Licensing and Environmental Health have identified would, if adhered to, go a long way to ensuring that your premises does not engage with any of the four licensing objectives.

As stated at the meeting, we shall continue to carry out unannounced visits to your premises along with other licensed premises during out of hours visit to see if you are keeping to the promises made at this meeting.

We are hopefully that you would take good professional advice and ensure that your premises is no longer the source of complaints from residents.

This letter states what was discussed and agreed with residents and officers and actions that the premises needs to take as soon as possible to enable the premises comply with food safety regulations.

<u>LICENSING ACT 2003 – PREM-LIC\1815</u> MEETING WITH SICAN, RESIDENTS AND COUNCIL OFFICERS 21ST MARCH 2024

Yesterday, 21st March 2024 a meeting took place in the evening at a public park a short distance from the premises, with the legal representative of SICAN; Marcus Lovall, the current designated premises supervisor Mr Remi Jackson and other members of staff of the premises. In attendance was also the team leader Noise & Pollution Team and team leader, Licensing. The meeting was in two halves as another meeting was held with the premises within the premises at the end of the meeting with the residents.

At the end of this meeting, Marcus speaking on behalf of the premises, and in the presence of residents, gave the following pledge: -

- 1. That there is a noise limiter in the premises, but that this will be calibrated and set by council noise officers to an acceptable level, such that music from the premises, if maintained at the setting, shall not be a source of disturbance to residents in neighbouring premises.
- 2. That henceforth, from 10pm, there shall be an on street visible presence of staff members which shall constitute of, at least, the duty manager and another member of the security staff, both to be in high visibility vests. Security staff / dispersal wardens numbers to be increased where deemed necessary, such as on special event nights.
- 3. Body cameras shall be worn by the SIA security staff.
- 4. They shall actively disperse people/customers away from residential areas and towards Tottenham Court Road. The Premises has conceded that their responsibility for peaceful dispersal of patrons extends from the premises to "line of sight" of patrons, either side of the venue.
- 5. Acoustic lobby to be installed at both entrance of the premises to reduce noise from music breakout from the premises when customers leave or enter the venue.
- 6. There shall be no more use of "Party Bus" by the premises.

- 7. Due to the presence of mice witnessed inside the premises during the second meeting with the premises inside the venue, professional pest control service shall be engaged to ensure that the premises is rid of all infestation in any form or shape, to include pest treatment and pest proofing of premises. I have copied the team leader pest control in Camden into this correspondence for his information.
- 8. The kitchen which is being used to service the premises with cooked food shall be registered with the council's food safety service immediately. I have copied the team leader for Food Safety into this correspondence for her information.
- 9. The provision of dancing in any form shall cease unless authorised by submission. For the premises to continue to provide dancing, the premises shall apply for a variation of the premises licence to include :- Performance of Dance.
- 10. The premises shall provide a copy of the contract currently in place for the collection of waste products generated by the premises in the course of its operation. The current practice of placing black refuse bags just outside the venue.
- 11. Due to the unacceptable state of cleanliness of the premises, i.e. sticky tables and floors, toilets seats with remnants of what looks like tobacco, and the dirt matted red carpet on the stairs leading from the front door the premises to the lower floors. A deep cleansing of the premises shall be undertaken such that the whole premises is hygienically clean.

The premises was also informed that officers shall be visiting the premises targeting close of business to see how the premises manages dispersal of visitors at the end of its closing hours.

We also informed you that given the level of complaints being made against the premises, by residents and the fact that both the police and council officers have actually witnessed from your premises, a scene similar to that which the residents are complaining about, should officers witness **ANY** breach of the conditions on the licence or of the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, we shall have no option but to consider all options available to us including a review of your premises licence; the result of which if successful could have an adverse effect on your operation.

It is hoped that with the meeting yesterday and the agreed steps to be taken these should address all the concerns that residents have.

I am Pc Christopher Malone 2487CN and have been a police officer for over 21 years. My current role is a Police Licensing officer for the London Borough of Camden.

I have been made aware that Sican, 26-28 Whitfield Street W1T 2RG is currently been taken to review by the residents. Since the review process has been initiated, I have looked through the Police indices too, to see if the MPS would support the review.

The MPS would like to submit a representation regarding the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

On the 21st June 2024 at 1730 hours Immigration Officers attended the venue and found the following:-

- Two workers ran out of a side door in uniform when Immigration officers entered the venue.
- Three adult males from Honduras were arrested as over stayers and detained.
- One male from Nicaragua was arrested and bailed due to an asylum claim.
- One male from Nicaragua was arrested as an illegal entrant and detained.
- One male from Honduras was arrested as an overstayed and detained.
- Two male from the Philippines encountered and cleared.

Total of five arrests of people who had no right to work in the UK.

Police Licensing visits:

On the 28th July 2024 at midnight, Officers spoke to on duty Manager Mr ****** about the ongoing public nuisance noise complaints caused by noisy customers at dispersal. During out visit there were at least three members of staff outside engaging with customers and trying to usher them away. However, the street was still very noisy and many of the customers remained directly outside the venue chatting to each other whilst they made further plans or waited for taxis etc. We explained to the Manager that residents were still complaining and that they were looking into launching a residents review so the venue were advised to make immediate changes and take steps to reduce the nuisance.

On the 7th September 2024 at 2330 hours, officers heard some loud	booming pulsating music on arrival and did
a walk around the neighbourhood to find it. Eventually we found the	source which was a private residence at 25
Goodge Street. The occupant at 25 Goodge Street	, admitted
the music was from his party and he agreed to turn the music down.	A local resident aware of the Sican issues

spotted us and was present when we addressed the private party. Sican itself was not noisy due to music but had a few customers on the opposite side of the road smoking and chatting. Seemed to be about ten customers outside, not behaving disorderly, but chatting loudly.

On the 19th October 2024 at 00:40 hours - Five females leaving the venue were in good spirits and making noise but otherwise no disorder. There were no members of staff monitoring and managing the exit and outside area.

<u>Crimes and Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) reports:</u>

1 - Crime Report 2306104/24 for ABH refers.

On the 30th December 2023 at around 00:20 hours the victim was awoken by loud shouting and screaming. The noise was so loud victim went to see what was going on and discovered four young women intoxicated outside Sican Restaurant and Club on Whitfield Street. Two of them were sitting on the roadside, they were struggling to stand up. Another Sican customer tried to engage with the ladies, and this made the noise even louder as the male was also not sober. The victim approached the doorman at Sican and politely requested, "Please can you ask your customers to be quieter and respect the local residents who are trying to sleep?" To the victim's surprise, the doorman dismissively replied, "They aren't our customers." The victim questioned the doorman's response, to which he responded, "They are not our customers?" This was clearly a lie as this pattern of extreme noise from the highly intoxicated customers leaving Sican happens every weekend following their limited time bottomless drinking events. At this point, the intoxicated man, who was trying to get involved with the four young women approached the doorman and the victim. He was very large and intimidating and started shouting at the victim and stood in front of the victim very aggressively. The victim states that it felt like he was looking for a fight. As the victim was afraid of this man, he turned and walked back towards his residence, while the man hurled insults at the victim. In an attempt to de-escalate, this situation the victim raised his hand in a stop Gesture. This seemed to aggravate the Sican customer as he charged after the victim. The victim continued to walk on and when he looked back to assess the situation, the male lunged at the victim. Fearing a punch, the victim braced myself, only to be engulfed in a forceful bear hug and slammed into the metal fence. The doorman watched on as this unfolded. The victim was terrified by the male's aggression, size, and strength. The victim pleaded with the doorman for help. Shockingly, instead of intervening, the doorman approached them and began questioning, as the victim. This was being recorded on the doorman's camera. Desperate for assistance, the victim yelled for someone to call the police. The man's grip tightened, causing him pain and terror. Fortunately, someone heard his screams for help and rushed out, followed by two helpful staff members from Sican, who struggled to remove the violent customer from squeezing the victim. Throughout, the doorman remained a bystander, instead of aiding. The door supervisor's inaction exacerbated the situation, putting the victim's safety at risk.

2- CAD 7296 of the 03/03/2024 at 23:35 hours outside Sican 26-28 WHITFIELD.

Report stating a big fight outside Sican. Groups fighting, multiple fighting, glass been smashed.

CAD 7299: of the 03/03/2024 at 23:35 hours relates to the same incident above. There is a massive fight happening. There is over 100 people fighting.

Officer on scene states: Male seen going towards right side of street, one person has a cut to the face. Fight between 2 males.

Another officer reports: Roughly 100 outside, actually 20 to 30 involved. All dispersed. Male with injuries refused to engage, refused medical help, refused first aid, supported by his friend.

At 00:19 hours the officer reports that there is only 10 people left, good natured and waiting for taxis.

3- Report: 01/157484/24 - Administer poison/noxious thing to injure/annoy.

On the 23/03/2024 the victim went to the CRAZY BEAR (Sican) 26-28 WHITFIELD STREET W1T, where she and a friend had a bottomless brunch. Victim stated that she and her friend had four (4) drinks each, and both became blackout drunk which is not usual for either of them. Victims states that she was spiked, as she has never had blackouts like that before, especially with that amount of drinks.

WITNESS ACCOUNT: The witness contacted a friend who informed her that she was out that night with her friend. When she saw the victim and her friend on WINDMILL ST, they looked 'dead' and they checked the girls pulse. A male was then there who was descried as: Italian, tall, slim, full head of hair, he is the male who called an ambulance as he was concerned for them. She stated they gave the girls water, and stayed with them until the ambulance arrived and one of the victim's sisters arrived.

4- CAD 2353 of the 07/04/2024.

Around 17:00 on Saturday 6th April 2024, the informant started hearing a lot of shrieking, shouting and generally drunken sounding behaviour outside their home and on Whitfield Street near the SICAN restaurant/night club. Since this has become a regular occurrence outside SICAN, the informant decided to go out and video the ASB on his iPhone. The SICAN doorman must have either seen him videoing the clients who had come out of SICAN, or the women who were being filmed could have told him. As the informant was returning to his door, the Sican doorman/bouncer followed him. He shouted something like, "Ah, number three." In other words, a threatening equivalent of, "I know where you live". The informant replied by saying that, "You'll get a report about this" to which he said "You'll get something from me."

5 - CAD 126 of the 27/07/2024 at 00:17 hours outside Sican 26-28 WHITFIELD.

Caller stated that people are fighting outside the restaurant. Caller states that 20 people are fighting, no weapons seen. The informant stating they are now at the side of the restaurant. The Operator states that they can hear screaming and shouting in the background.

Officer attended at 00:49. By then no one was about. The reason the officers took so long to get to the incident is because there was no units to attend the call initially due to all units tied up on other jobs.

6- Crime reference 01/674747/24 - Knife arrest.

On the 03/08/2024 at 16:33 hours the suspect has entered the venue, in which their policy is that everyone gets searched on entry. Suspect has then left and returned, to which he has had another search and has been found with a pocket knife on him. The venue have called the police and male was arrested. Good work by the venue on this occasion.

7 - Crime reference 01/924350/24 - Administering a substance with intent

On the 04/10/2024 at 19:15 hours the informant states that her friend and she went out last night. They are sure they got spiked. They had 2 Cocktails and on the 3rd cocktail they couldn't hold their heads up. She felt paralytic. We drink every weekend and usually fine. After the 3rd cocktail, they both completely blacked out. They had bruises on their bodies. It took them1 hour and 30 minutes to get to Victoria Station, which was only 15 minutes away.

They began to throw up. They state that once they left Sican they do not remember anything. One states she remembers her friend being sick. Then being on the train they were projectile vomiting. The bruising on one was on her arms and the other was on her ankles and feet. They got home safe but don't remember getting home.

Criminal Intelligence Report EKRT00634689

SICAN WHITFIELD STREET -- Predatory behaviour by male towards females at venue. Informant has described a MALE who attends **SICAN** 26-28 WHITFIELD STREET W1T and specifically pays attention to female visitors to this venue. Male normally attends SATURDAY's and SUNDAYS from 1800 to 2000 HOURS.INFORMANT states that his has been an ongoing issue for the past year or so.

Informant states that the MALE has initially stated that he is only attending the location to make a noise complaint. However the MALE is almost always seen paying particular attention to female visitors. Informant states that on one occasion they have managed to look at the MALE's phone to see that his camera has been zoomed at females at the venue. Informant states that they are very concerned as many females visit **SICAN** and that the Male has been observed approaching lone females, some of which may be drunk at the time and quite vulnerable. Informant states that they have warned about his behaviour, however he continues to return.

Summary:

There is many concerns about this business. In the last year of operating there has been mass fights occurring on the street attributed to the venue. Two reports of spiking, however this could be that the females were just too intoxicated. There seems to be no monitoring or safeguarding vulnerable people.

Another big concern is the employment of illegal immigrants. There was not one but multiple people arrested and two more running away when the immigration visit occurred.

With all the evidence above, the MPs have huge concerns about the management, especially when they are breaking the law and therefore we support the residents review with revocation of the licence.

I am willing to attend Court in relation to this matter.

Supporting Statement in relation to the application to Review the Premises Licence of 'Sican, 26-28 Whitefield Street, W1T 2RG'.

The London Borough of Camden's Noise & Pollution Team (NPT) writes in support of the application submitted by Residents and the Licensing Team to review the premises licence issued in respect of 'Sican, 26-28 Whitefield Street, W1T 2RG'.

Due to numerous complaints of noise nuisance, the NPT supports the Licensing Team and Residents in their application to Review the Premises Licence.

The Noise & Pollution Team received in total 34 noise complaints since 2022, and of those, 31 were received in 2024. Primarily, the noise complaints were received as a result of drunken patrons causing disturbance outside the premises and during premises closure (dispersal issue). The NPT have not substantiated the complaints, however, this may be due to the fact that the complaints were received post incident or due to service demand at the time of the disturbance. The service did witness on one occasion patrons congregating and causing a dispersal issue in May 2024 via a proactive visit. However, in regards to the complaints received on the 'Out of Hours Noise Service', the NPT have not substantiated those complaints.

Given the nature and number of the complaints received, primarily external dispersal and loitering issues, in the opinion of the NPT, this would suggest that the Licensing objectives are at serious risk of being undermined.

The NPT now has serious doubts about the ability of the operator to conduct the premises in a manner that promotes the Licensing objectives and due to the number of complaints received, it is evident that the 'Public Nuisance' objective of the Licensing Act 2003 is being undermined.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is believed that revocation of the premises licence in the first instance would be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, in particular, the prevention of 'Public Nuisance'. Secondly, a robust 'Dispersal and Smoking Policy' must be submitted and approved by all the relevant Responsible Authorities before operation resumes.

Alternatively, the Licensing Sub-Committee could seek to modify the premises licence and remove the exemptions applying to live music, recorded music and any entertainment of a similar description under Sections 177(A(3), 177A(4) and 52(4)(b) of the Licensing Act 2003.

Representations are being made for the following reasons:

The Licensing Act 2003 outlines 4 objectives that are to be upheld, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) is concerned regarding the prevention of crime and disorder.

Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) considers that the manager is not taking suitable measures to prevent crime and disorder. The business has employed illegal workers which is prohibited under the Licensing Act 2003 and the Immigration Act 1971 (as amended).

Employing illegal workers in the UK has the following impact on the community and society as a whole: -

- It deprives HMRC and the Government of revenue by non-payment of tax and national insurance.
- It exploits the undocumented by paying them less than the minimum wage and provides no employment or income protection.
- It encourages those without permission to work to seek similar employment.
- It allows a business to unfairly undercut other businesses by employing cheap labour.
- Illegal workers are often housed in cramped and unsatisfactory conditions by the employer as part of their working arrangement.

On 21 July 2024, Central London ICE conducted an illegal working visit to Sican, 26-28 Whitfield ST, London W1T 2RG. While entering the premises, officers noticed that all employees wore black uniform which identified staff working at Sican. Officers approached a male who was behind the bar and asked if he was in charge. He stated he was not and called someone from downstairs. A male appeared from downstairs and identified himself as, the head chef and stated the manager was outside.
Whilst waiting for the manager, officers waiting outside the premises noticed there were two people who opened the door wearing black uniform. When they were approached by officers, and asked if they work at the premises, without answering both individuals ran and escaped. Both officers ran after them however they were split up in two different directions and evaded officers.
The following four individuals were encountered at the premises and identified as illegal workers,
was found working in the kitchen when officers encountered him. They had to use force to restrain him from escaping. It claimed he had been employed at the premises for three months as a cleaner. He stated he works three days a week doing around 20-25 hours per week and receives £10 per hour in cash. It confirmed that the employer did not request for proof of right to work prior commencing work. Home Office checks showed that It claimed for protection on arrival to the UK in January 2023. His claim was withdrawn due to non-compliance in February 2024. It had no right to work in the UK.
was encountered in the kitchen of the premises in full uniform. He stated that he worked as chef at the premises for just over a year. RIGHT TO WORK CHECKS AND THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

The objective of the Licensing Act 2003 (the Act) is to provide a clear, transparent framework for making decisions about applications by individuals or businesses wishing to sell or supply alcohol or provide certain types of regulated entertainment and late-night refreshment.

There are four licensing objectives which underpin the Act, and which need to be taken into account and promoted throughout the licensing process.

The licensing objectives are:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance and
- the protection of children from harm

Sican has been found employing illegal workers. This business has clearly failed to meet the prevention of crime and disorder objective. The license holder would have been aware of their responsibilities to uphold the licensing objectives as they are clearly defined as part of the premises license application. It is an offence to work when a person is disqualified to do so, and such an offence can only be committed with the co-operation of a premises licence holder or its agents.

The employer could have protected themselves and prevented crime and disorder by completing a straightforward right to work check. In this case the employer had not seen any documents for none of the employees prior to commencing work. Should the license holder have attempted these checks, the workers would have failed at the first stage. This would have quickly and easily confirmed that they had no right to work, and the license holder could have protected themselves from employing illegal workers. All employers are dutybound by law to conduct these checks if they wish to avoid being penalised if found to have employed someone who is prohibited from working, and guidance can be found on the gov.uk website or by using a search engine. Additional information on how to conduct these checks is available online, this includes the Home Office's official YouTube page.

The use of illegal labour provides an unfair competitive edge and deprives the UK economy of tax revenue. Illegal workers are often paid below the minimum wage (itself an offence) and National Insurance payments are not paid. A key draw for illegal immigration is work and low-skilled migrants that are increasingly vulnerable to exploitation by unlawful enterprises, finding themselves in sub-standard accommodation and toiling in poor working conditions for long hours.

Whether by negligence or willful blindness illegal workers were engaged in activity on the premises. Section 182 guidance of the Licensing Act 2003 at point 11.27 states that certain activity

should be treated particularly seriously, and this includes employing someone who is disqualified
from that work by reason of their immigration status in the UK. 11.28 of the guidance states that it
is expected that revocation of the licence - even in the first instance - should be seriously
considered.

REVIEW OF THE PREMISES LICENCE:

This Review application has been made on behalf of 38 residents who live in the immediate vicinity of the Sican Restaurant – this number of residents reflects the seriousness of the situation with regard to the behaviour of this licensed premises.

In their request for this Review, the residents are asking for various amendments to the Premises Licence. We are supportive of all their requests.

But in particular, their requests include:

(a). To have a "restaurant-type" condition,

whereby alcohol can only be supplied/sold to a customer who is seated, having a table meal, and the alcohol is ancillary to the meal.

Our Association has made representations on many Licensing applications in Fitzrovia over the years, since the Licensig Act came into being.

From our experience, and unless it is an actual bar or pub, we invariably ask for a "restaurant" condition, in order to prevent premises becoming and/or behaving like a bar, with bar-type activities.

We think that this is a particularly important condition within the Fitzrovia area, and especially with its long-established and diverse residential community throughout the area, in order to help protect the residential amenity of those living living near by a premises.

Sican appears to be behaving more like a bar (or club); and thus we strongly support the residents' request for a "restaurant-type" Condition, to ensure that Sican behaves like a restaurant.

(b). To have no "bottomless brunches":

We are strongly supportive of this request.

Sican's website promotes the "bottomless brunches", which appear to be one of the main reasons for noise and disturbance to residents.

On websites, the definition of "bottomless brunches" is given as "... a brunch during which guests can order unlimited alcohol".

This type of activity is more like that for a bar or a club, and not for a restaurant.

(c). To reduce to hours:

We are also strongly supportive of the request to reduce the Hours; and to reduce them to Framework Hours.

The current closing times are well past midnight for every day of the week (and midnight on Sunday) meaning that for immediate residents and their families, their residential amenity is badly affected, and where the expectation should be for a peaceful night's sleep.

Inevitably, noise continues in the street beyond these times, as people leave the premises and the street at the last minute.

These current Closing Times are:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday: half-past Midnight;

Thursday, Friday Saturday: 1.30am;

Sunday: midnight.

The police sent me an automated response with the reference number: BOS-18380-24-0101-03 I attach a scan of two of the pages from the police form I completed, detailing the incident. I have a photograph of the SICAN doorman/bouncer who threatened me and a video I can share with you of the incident. Please let me know how I may share the photo and video file with you. I think that when ASB turns into threatening behaviour by the man who is supposed to control the ASB outside SICAN, then maybe the council should take this long running situation seriously and initiate effective action against the owners and managers of SICAN. As a result of the threatening behaviour by the doorman /bouncer yesterday, as well as the regular drunken shrieking, shouting and screaming in Whitfield St and Colville Place, my wife and I no longer feel safe in the vicinity of SICAN, let alone in our own home. I strongly support this application, in particular insofar as it relates to the control of drinking at and outside the premises and the need for dispersal of people leaving Sican late in the evening. The problem is that people leaving the premises at the end of the evening have, by that time of night, almost always had a great deal to drink and seem to be keen to continue their socialising outside the premises, often long after closing time. There is, particularly on Fridays and Saturdays, regularly loud



shouting and excited screaming which wakes me and my partner, even with my windows closed (although I don't see why I should have to close my windows throughout the year, just to keep out the noise caused by those leaving the venue). I used to go out to ask if they could keep the noise down (or to ask the staff at Sican to try and disperse the crowd) but this simply provoked abusive and aggressive responses from the people leaving the premises. Even the staff have been positively insulting (although not aggressive) when asked to assist with the noise problem. Needless to say, my attempts to ask a group of rowdy and inebriated people to keep the noise down are fruitless; and I no longer even try. What I can say is that there is regularly a group of 30-40 people outside the premises after closing time, continuing their evening with zero consideration for people living nearby and paying no heed at all to requests to keep the noise down - its is frankly an intimidating situation even to ask. A further problem is that Colville Place (a pedestrian alley) has become a public toilet for people during the time that they remain out on Whitfield St after they have left Sican. The alley has a number of trees, plant pots etc and accordingly provides ladies with a more discreet place to urinate than elsewhere. Unfortunately it also provides a (relatively) discreet place to defecate as well, which is particularly unwelcome. I do not know how practical it is to expect staff at the premises to disperse people once they have left the premises - it seems to me that the only practical solution here is to try to limit the



amount of alcohol that gets consumed; and to move the closing times to earlier in the evening - it seems to me absurd to have a venue putting very drunk people out into a residential street late at night. The consequences of doing so are obvious and are a real blight on the life of local residents.

The terrible disruption to residents' lives caused by the chaos of exceedingly drunken and uncontrollable Sican customers is far, far worse than anything I' ve experienced in 25 years of living in Colville Place. We are regularly and frequently woken (often as late as way after midnight) by screaming, shouting, fighting etc from highly intoxicated Sican customers, as well as by the sounding of horns and music blaring from the cars which collect



the party goers. Antisocial behaviour from Sican can start as early as mid afternoon as the first booking period at Sican ends. It is very intimdating and frequently threatening to be around Sican when inebriate, hostile party goers are leaving at their events' end (events are seemingly at two hour intervals). Sican's customers are so incredibly drunk and wired that they often vomit in Whitfield Street and along Colville Place - and Sican's near paralytic customers often urinate outside our houses. The few visible staff, usually just one, are unable to control such excessively drunken people (frankly ten staff wouldn't be able to control the worst behaviour I've witnessed) and Sican management can be hostile when requested to control their customers. On Thursday 10 October I endured screaming, shouting and loud music from Sican and customers from 7.30pm. By 10.35 pm when I wanted to go to bed - I went to Sican to speak to staff to request that they control the ASB. Outside there were party goers drinking, inhaling gas from balloons and dancing in the streets to music coming from Sican. There was no security on the doors which were wide open. I went inside to find managerial staff but could find none on the ground floor where a DJ was playing incredibly loud music to people dancing and drinking. I went downstairs in search of management or security but there was none - there was however a second dj playing loud music with people dancing and drinking. I quickly left to go back home, the anti-social behaviour just carried on. It was one huge, uregulated lawless party. I also suffer from a chronic medical condition and



the continual interruption to my sleep and the anxiety caused by the threatening, out of control, riotously noisy anti-social behaviour is incredibly injurious to my health and well being.

Sican regularly is the cause of noise disturbance and safety concerns caused by their customers gathering outside their property late in the evening and late into the night. I often felt intimidated and occasionally unsafe walking back in front of the venue late at night knowing that fights often broke out



and that the door staff have been threatening to my neighbours. The noise late at night did wake me up, with very drunk customers shouting as they left along Colville Place. I attach several pictures as examples of the people hanging around outside and a group of young drunk people making there way along Colville Place at 6pm. This is a quiet residential area whose peaceful existence has been disturbed by Sican late into the night weekend after weekend. The licence needs to be reviewed to reduce the hours they are open for and to prohibit customers standing outside at all hours. As residents we tried to engage with the management of Sican and had a meeting with them but until the point I moved there was no change in the management of their customers, if anything it got worse.



Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. The supply of alcohol is prohibited at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises.
- 2. The supply of alcohol is prohibited at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must
 - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.
- 5. But nothing in subsection (4) requires such a condition to be imposed -
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to -
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- 6. For the purposes of this section-
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies[and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3(2) of that Act)], and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.
- 7. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises



- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 8. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 9. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 10. The responsible person must ensure that
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied



having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 11. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 12. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 11
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—P = D + (DxV)

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; —
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (I) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.



- 13. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of 12 above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 14. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

15. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means:

Monday - Wednesday (excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday) : 10.00-00.00

Thursday - Saturday (excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday) : 10.00-01.00

Sunday (excluding Christmas Day) and Good Friday: 12.00-23.30 Christmas Day: 12.00-22.30

These hours are extended from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve (i.e. 23.00 or 22.30) to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day (i.e. 10.00 or 12.00).

- 16. The above condition (15) does not prohibit:
 - a. during the first thirty minutes after the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol, the consumption of alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied as ancillary to the meals;
 - b. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
 - c. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or the taking of, sale or supply to, any person residing on the premises;
 - d. the sale or supply of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - e. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a residing there;
 - f. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
 - g. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of alcohol, so supplied, if the



- alcohol is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises;
- h. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.
- 17. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for one hour following the hours set out above and between 15.00 and 19.00 on Christmas Day to persons taking a table meal in the premises, in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out in condition 7 above shall continue to apply.
- 18. Unless otherwise specified on this licence, no regulated entertainment, other than by way of music and singing only which is provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound, shall take place at the premises with the exception of pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dancing for pre-invited guests.
- 19. Regulated entertainment, for which there is no licence, may not take place on the licensed premises, as detailed by the plan, if members of the public are admitted.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority (24/07/2008)

- 20. Alcohol and non-intoxicating beverages should only be supplied to and consumed by those customers seated either at tables or at the bar, after 11pm on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays.
- 21. No new customers should be admitted onto the premises after 11.30pm on Thursdays and after midnight on Fridays or Saturdays.

Section 1: Background comments of the Borough Solicitor

- 1.1 The purpose of Camden's Statement of Licensing Policy is to make it clear to applicants that wider considerations will be taken into account when determining applications. It is intended to guide the Licensing Panel when considering licence applications. However, the Licensing Panel must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where the circumstances of the application justify allowing an exception. The burden is on the applicant to show that they comply with the policy.
- 1.2 Members should only address those matters that have formed the subject matter of relevant representations. Matters that arise that are not the subject of relevant representations fall outside the function that the Panel is exercising when it holds a hearing
- 1.3 Members must determine, having regard for the evidence, whether granting the application for a premises licence will impact adversely on the policy criteria listed in paragraph 3 of this report.
- 1.4 In accordance with the provisions of Part 1 of Schedule 5 of the Act, where a Licensing Authority rejects in whole or in part, an application for a new premises licence, the applicant may appeal against the decision, to a magistrate's court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.5 Similarly, where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application contends that the licence ought not to have been granted, or that different or additional conditions should have been imposed on the licence, he may appeal against the decision to a magistrate's court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.6 The Human Rights Act 1998 incorporates the key articles of the European Convention on Human Rights into domestic law. Decisions on licensing matters are actions of a public authority and must be compatible with Convention rights. Consequently, Members of the Panel must be aware of the rights contained in the Convention (particularly those set out below) when making licensing decisions.

(a) Article 6: Right to a fair trial

In the determination of his civil rights and obligations, everyone is entitled to a fair and public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law.

(b) Article 8: Right to respect for private and family life Everyone has a right to respect for his or her private life, his home and correspondence.

(c) Article 1 of the First Protocol: Protection of property

Every natural or legal person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions, including a licence. No one shall be deprived of his possession except in the public interest and subject to the conditions provided for by law and by the general principles of international law.

(d) Article 10: Freedom of Expression

Everyone has the right to freedom of expression. This right shall include freedom to hold opinions and to receive and impart information and ideas without interference by public authority and regardless of frontiers. This Article shall not prevent States from requiring the licensing of broadcasting, television or cinema enterprises.

The exercise of these freedoms since it carries with it duties and responsibilities may be subject to such formalities, conditions, restrictions or penalties as are prescribed by law and are necessary in a democratic society, in the interests of national security, territorial integrity or public safety, for the prevention of disorder or crime, for the protection of health and morals, for the protection of the reputation or rights of others, for preventing the disclosure of information received in confidence, or for maintaining the authority and impartiality of the judiciary.

(e) Article 14: Prohibition of discrimination

The enjoyment of the rights and freedoms set forth in this Convention shall be secured without discrimination on any ground such as sex, race, colour, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, association with a national minority, property, birth, or other status.

1.7 When formulating policy local authorities must have regard to the Equality Act 2010. The Act provides protection from discrimination in respect of certain protected characteristics, namely: age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or beliefs and sex and sexual orientation. It places the Council under a legal duty to have due regard to the advancement of equality in the exercise of its powers including licensing powers. Members of the panel must be mindful of this duty when determining all licensing applications.

The section 149 Public Sector Equality Duty

- (1) A public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to—
- (a) eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it;
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it.

- (2) A person who is not a public authority but who exercises public functions must, in the exercise of those functions, have due regard to the matters mentioned in subsection (1).
- (3) Having due regard to the need to advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it involves having due regard, in particular, to the need to—
- (a) remove or minimise disadvantages suffered by persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are connected to that characteristic;
- (b) take steps to meet the needs of persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are different from the needs of persons who do not share it;
- (c) encourage persons who share a relevant protected characteristic to participate in public life or in any other activity in which participation by such persons is disproportionately low.
- (4) The steps involved in meeting the needs of disabled persons that are different from the needs of persons who are not disabled include, in particular, steps to take account of disabled persons' disabilities.
- (5) Having due regard to the need to foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it involves having due regard, in particular, to the need to—
- (a) tackle prejudice, and
- (b) promote understanding.
- (6) Compliance with the duties in this section may involve treating some persons more favourably than others; but that is not to be taken as permitting conduct that would otherwise be prohibited by or under this Act.
- 1.8 In determining any application, the Council must comply with the public sector equality duty in s.149 of the 2010 Act. This is a duty to have regard to the need to achieve the statutory goals of s.149, rather than to achieve a particular result. The s149 duty sits alongside and does not override statutory requirements in relation to determining licensing applications, including the duty to consider all evidence on its merits and the legislative criteria listed at paragraphs 3 & 4.
- 1.9 When members have before them representations or other material on issues relevant to s149, even outside the scope of "standard" licensing considerations such material must still be specifically assessed in the context of s149. However, because s149 creates a requirement to "have regard" the fact a matter raised is relevant to s149 will not automatically translate into a reason for refusing an application that would be sustainable in any subsequent appeal, given the legal requirement to determine applications in compliance with licensing legislation.
