1. Application

- 1.1 This is an application to review a premises licence under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 Any determination of the Licensing Panel shall not have effect until:
 - a) The end of the period given for appealing against the decision; or
 - b) If the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of
- 1.3 The premises is licensed for:
 - a) Supply of Alcohol (For consumption on/off the premises)

10:00 – 00:00 Monday to Sunday

b) Recorded Music

10:00 - 00:00 Monday to Sunday

c) Live Music

10:00 – 23:00 Monday to Sunday

d) Provision of Facilities for Dancing

10:00 – 00:00 Monday to Sunday

e) Late Night Refreshment

23:00 - 00:00 Monday to Sunday

All of the above hours are extended on New Years Eve from the terminal hour to the start hour on New Years Day

2. Reason for the review

2.1 This review is requested by Haverstock Action Group consisting of 11 residents. They believe that the licensing objectives, the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance are not being upheld. The group states there is excessive noise from live music late at night that has become unbearable, and the premises are in breach of conditions on their premises licence. Despite numerous warnings and interactions from the authorities and attempts made by the residents to resolve these ongoing issues the venue is persistently breaching their licence conditions and causing public nuisance.

2.2 The Haverstock Action group seek to change the hours for live music to be restricted to finish at 10pm and to be monitored for volume. The hours for recorded music should be restricted to 10am - 10:30pm which includes the function room.

3. Background

- 3.1 Twelve relevant representations have been received in relation to the application.
- 3.2 Two representations are in support of the application to review the premises licence and these are from the Licensing Authority responsible authority, and a Councillor. Environmental Health responsible authority have not submitted a representation but have provided a list of complaints for the premises.
- 3.3 Ten representations oppose the application to review the premises licence and these are from members of the public. **Appendix 3**
