



All staff who sells alcohol will be trained in the role by the DPS with regular refresher training. Records of training will be kept and made available for examining officers of the relevant authorities. Where a person appears to be under the age 25, identification in the form of passport, photo driving licence or a proof of age card bearing the pass hologram will be sought





and if not provided service of alcohol will be refused. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of entry and at the service area advising customers that the premises operates the "challenge 25" proof of age scheme.

Dear Licensing Team, I am writing to formally oppose the alcohol license application (APP\PREMISES-NEW\125612) for "Heaven Supermarket at 2 Milburn Lane NW1 9FA". As a resident of 28 Agar Grove, I am deeply concerned about the negative impact this establishment would have on our community. The housing development





in this area was designed to improve living standards and foster a thriving, safe, and cohesive community. Allowing the establishment of an off-licence in this location would undermine these objectives, negatively impacting the development, the community, and the long-term prosperity of the area. 1. Prevention of Crime and Disorder The introduction of an additional off-licence in this area is likely to increase alcohol-related antisocial behaviour, including public drunkenness, loitering, and disturbances. These issues are particularly concerning given the residential nature of the neighbourhood and its proximity to families and children. 2. Prevention of Public Nuisance An off-licence in this residential setting is likely to exacerbate public nuisance issues, including late-night loitering, noise disturbances, and antisocial behavior. These disruptions would significantly compromise the peace, safety, and well-being of local residents, including families and children who live and play in the area, 3. Protection of Children from Harm The proposed site's proximity to children and family gathering spaces raises concerns about exposing children to inappropriate and disruptive behaviour. Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. A digital CCTV system WILL be installed in the premises complying with the following criteria:
 - 1) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors and floor areas.
 - 2) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
 - 3) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
 - 4) Provide a linked record of the date, time, and place of any image.
 - 5) Provide good quality images.
 - 6) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
 - 7) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet.
 - 8) Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality.
 - 9) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention.
 - 10) Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation.
 - 11)Digital images must be kept for 31 days.
 - 12)Police or authorised local authority employees will have access to images at any reasonable time.
 - 13) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Immediate copies must be made available to Police or authorised local authority employees on request.
- 2. Emergency light will be installed and fire extinguisher will be installed. The fire exit is free of any impediment or obstacle at all time of the operating hours.
- 3. A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information.
- 4. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons

authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.

- 5. The premises will take measures to reduce street drinking outside the premises.
- 6. All occasions when persons have been refused service will be recorded in a refusals book, which shall be kept at the premises for not less than 12 months.
- 7. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of exit advising customers leave the premises quietly.
- 8. Deliveries to the premises shall only be made during these hours (08:00 AM 18:00 PM).
- 9. We will be very strict to not sell alcohol to children and under age.
- 10. Any alcohol must be sold by DPS or a person authorised be the DPS at all times.
- 11. All staff who sells alcohol will be trained in the role by the DPS with regular refresher training.
- 12. Records of training will be kept and made available for examining officers of the relevant authorities.
- 13. Where a person appears to be under the age 25, identification in the form of passport, photo driving licence or a proof of age card bearing the pass hologram will be sought and if not provided service of alcohol will be refused.
- 14. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of entry and at the service area advising customers that the premises operates the "challenge 25" proof of age scheme.

Conditions agreed with the Police

- 1. Police must be called to incidents of violence and/or disorder where appropriate.
- 2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and be made available upon request to the Police or the Local Authority. The book will record the date, time and whom is making the entry. The following must be recorded:
 - a. All crime reported to the venue
 - b. All refused sales
 - c. Any complaints received
 - d. Any faults in the CCTV system
 - e. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

f. CAD reference numbers where Police are called

- 3. The premises licence holder shall not sell super strength beer, lager or cider with an alcohol content above 5.5% ABV or greater. This restriction shall not apply in respect of specialist branded premium priced products, for example Craft ales, local or microbrewery specialist products, boxed gifts or national celebratory/commemorative beer, lager or cider with alcohol content of 5.5% ABV or greater.
- 4. No miniature bottles of spirits of 20 cl or below shall be sold from the premises.
- 5. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container, be opened in the premises, or be consumed in the premises.
- 6. A sign shall be displayed at the point of sale stating "No Proof of Age No Sale".
- 7. No alcohol to be stored beneath the serving counters at any time.
- 8. All products to be paid for in full at the point of sale. No 'credit' to be offered to any customers.

Section 1: Background comments of the Borough Solicitor

- 1.1 The purpose of Camden's Statement of Licensing Policy is to make it clear to applicants that wider considerations will be taken into account when determining applications. It is intended to guide the Licensing Panel when considering licence applications. However, the Licensing Panel must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where the circumstances of the application justify allowing an exception. The burden is on the applicant to show that they comply with the policy.
- 1.2 Members should only address those matters that have formed the subject matter of relevant representations. Matters that arise that are not the subject of relevant representations fall outside the function that the Panel is exercising when it holds a hearing
- 1.3 Members must determine, having regard for the evidence, whether granting the application for a premises licence will impact adversely on the policy criteria listed in paragraph 3 of this report.
- 1.4 In accordance with the provisions of Part 1 of Schedule 5 of the Act, where a Licensing Authority rejects in whole or in part, an application for a new premises licence, the applicant may appeal against the decision, to a magistrate's court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.5 Similarly, where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application contends that the licence ought not to have been granted, or that different or additional conditions should have been imposed on the licence, he may appeal against the decision to a magistrate's court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.6 The Human Rights Act 1998 incorporates the key articles of the European Convention on Human Rights into domestic law. Decisions on licensing matters are actions of a public authority and must be compatible with Convention rights. Consequently, Members of the Panel must be aware of the rights contained in the Convention (particularly those set out below) when making licensing decisions.

(a) Article 6: Right to a fair trial

In the determination of his civil rights and obligations, everyone is entitled to a fair and public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law.

(b) Article 8: Right to respect for private and family life Everyone has a right to respect for his or her private life, his home and correspondence.

(c) Article 1 of the First Protocol: Protection of property

Every natural or legal person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions, including a licence. No one shall be deprived of his possession except in the public interest and subject to the conditions provided for by law and by the general principles of international law.

(d) Article 10: Freedom of Expression

Everyone has the right to freedom of expression. This right shall include freedom to hold opinions and to receive and impart information and ideas without interference by public authority and regardless of frontiers. This Article shall not prevent States from requiring the licensing of broadcasting, television or cinema enterprises.

The exercise of these freedoms since it carries with it duties and responsibilities may be subject to such formalities, conditions, restrictions or penalties as are prescribed by law and are necessary in a democratic society, in the interests of national security, territorial integrity or public safety, for the prevention of disorder or crime, for the protection of health and morals, for the protection of the reputation or rights of others, for preventing the disclosure of information received in confidence, or for maintaining the authority and impartiality of the judiciary.

(e) Article 14: Prohibition of discrimination

The enjoyment of the rights and freedoms set forth in this Convention shall be secured without discrimination on any ground such as sex, race, colour, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, association with a national minority, property, birth, or other status.

1.7 When formulating policy local authorities must have regard to the Equality Act 2010. The Act provides protection from discrimination in respect of certain protected characteristics, namely: age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or beliefs and sex and sexual orientation. It places the Council under a legal duty to have due regard to the advancement of equality in the exercise of its powers including licensing powers. Members of the panel must be mindful of this duty when determining all licensing applications.

The section 149 Public Sector Equality Duty

- (1) A public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to—
- (a) eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it;
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it.

- (2) A person who is not a public authority but who exercises public functions must, in the exercise of those functions, have due regard to the matters mentioned in subsection (1).
- (3) Having due regard to the need to advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it involves having due regard, in particular, to the need to—
- (a) remove or minimise disadvantages suffered by persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are connected to that characteristic;
- (b) take steps to meet the needs of persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are different from the needs of persons who do not share it;
- (c) encourage persons who share a relevant protected characteristic to participate in public life or in any other activity in which participation by such persons is disproportionately low.
- (4) The steps involved in meeting the needs of disabled persons that are different from the needs of persons who are not disabled include, in particular, steps to take account of disabled persons' disabilities.
- (5) Having due regard to the need to foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it involves having due regard, in particular, to the need to—
- (a) tackle prejudice, and
- (b) promote understanding.
- (6) Compliance with the duties in this section may involve treating some persons more favourably than others; but that is not to be taken as permitting conduct that would otherwise be prohibited by or under this Act.
- 1.8 In determining any application, the Council must comply with the public sector equality duty in s.149 of the 2010 Act. This is a duty to have regard to the need to achieve the statutory goals of s.149, rather than to achieve a particular result. The s149 duty sits alongside and does not override statutory requirements in relation to determining licensing applications, including the duty to consider all evidence on its merits and the legislative criteria listed at paragraphs 3 & 4.
- 1.9 When members have before them representations or other material on issues relevant to s149, even outside the scope of "standard" licensing considerations such material must still be specifically assessed in the context of s149. However, because s149 creates a requirement to "have regard" the fact a matter raised is relevant to s149 will not automatically translate into a reason for refusing an application that would be sustainable in any subsequent appeal, given the legal requirement to determine applications in compliance with licensing legislation.

Section 2: Financial Comments
