Customers at the bar will inevitably make the most of being able to drink into the early hours and to consume more alcohol leading to them shouting and laughing loudly as they go outside to smoke, get some fresh air, or when they leave. Customers will also have little or no regard for local residents who will be woken up after having usually fallen asleep at this time as they have to get up early for work. Ordering or hailing taxis to go home in the early hours will also cause another issue as those leaving venues usually come to Goodge Street to sit on the benches waiting for their booked cabs excitidly laughing and screaming loudly. People also shout to hail black cabs and when the taxis arrive there's also loud car doors slamming, and engines being left running. I have already made a complaint about the noise caused by a temporary license given to the Kinkally Bar which should be noted.
