1. Application

b) Recorded Music & Live Music

Monday to Saturday: 23:00 - 01:30 Sunday: 23:00 - 23:30

c) Opening hours

Monday to Thursday: 07:00 – 01:45 Friday to Saturday: 07:00 – 02:00

Sunday: 10:00 – 01:00

2. Reason for the review

- 2.1 The review has been submitted by the Metropolitan Police who believe that the licensing objective, the prevention of crime and disorder is not being upheld. This follows a series of visits to the premises and intervention meetings with the Licence Holder and representatives.
- 2.2 The Metropolitan Police have submitted comprehensive grounds for review which are set out in the Review Statement which, includes a timeline of visits and events.

- 2.3 The Applicant is seeking revocation of the premises licence

The times for framework hours on any given day are not (and should not be regarded as) the 'usual' or 'normal' hours for licensable activities in the Borough. Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighborhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.

- b) Modify the conditions of the licence
- c) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
- d) To remove the designated premises supervisor
- e) To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
- f) To revoke the licence
- 6.3 As with all options members will need to consider what is appropriate
