2. Reason for the review

- 2.1 The Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) believe that the Prevention of Crime & Disorder Licensing Objective is not being upheld. The MPS will offer evidence showing that those managing the venue are persistently undermining the Licensing Objectives. Even after extensive engagement with the premises licence holder and management, the MPS have not seen adequate improvement.
- 2.2 The MPS do not have sufficient confidence in the management's ability to maintain a safe and compliant venue. The issues linked to the venue are:
 - i. Crime and Disorder
 - ii. Persistent breaches of conditions
 - iii. Poor management of the venues
- 2.3 The MPS recommend a full revocation of the premises licence to ensure the licensing objectives are upheld.

Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighbourhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.

 - a) Allow the license to continue operating as before
 - b) Modify the conditions of the licence
 - c) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - d) To remove the designated premises supervisor
 - e) To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - f) To revoke the license
