Application

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. **Appendix 2**
- 1.2 The application is for:

a) Late Night Refreshment

23:00 -01:00 Monday to Sunday for customers dining on the premises. 23:00 – 02:00 Monday to Sunday for deliveries

b) Opening hours

11:00 – 02:30 Monday to Sunday

- 1.3 The applicant has agreed to accept a total of 10 additional conditions, requested by the Police, responsible authority. The conditions include that dining on the premises will terminate at 1am and deliveries allowed until 2am daily.
- 1.4 On the basis that the additional conditions have been agreed, the Police withdrawn their representations. Correspondence can be found at **Appendix 2**.

2. Representations

- 2.1 Seven relevant representations were received in relation to the application.
- 2.2 The representation opposes the application, and these are from a local Councillor, three resident associations and three residents.

3. Policy

Licensing objectives (Chapter Four Page 20 to 35 of the Policy)

- 3.1 The licensing objectives engaged by this application are:
 - a) Public Safety
 - b) The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - c) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - d) The Protection of Children from Harm

3.2 The premises is not situated in a cumulative impact policy area.

Hours policy (Chapter Five- Page 36 to 38 of the Policy)

3.3 The hours policy is engaged by this application in relation to the proposed end times for late night refreshment. The framework hours are given in the policy as:

No sale or supply of alcohol

Monday to Thursday 09:00 until 23:30 Friday and Saturday 09:00 until midnight 09:00 until 22:30

3.4 The times for the framework hours on any given day are not (and should not be regarded as) the "usual" or "normal" working hours for licensable activities in the Borough. Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighbourhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.

Women's Safety (Appendix One – Page 88 to 89 of the Policy)

3.5 The Council has adopted a set of principles that commit our licensed premises to act in a responsible manner, taking all forms of female harassment seriously and set out the practical steps licensed premises can take to support this.

The principles encourage all licensed premises to consider and implement them in the day to day operation of their premises and include:

- b. Supporting Each Other
- c. Training for All

The application does not include these principles.

- 5.4 Members are reminded that all applications must be considered on their own merits, and that findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
