1. Application

- 1.1 This is an application to Transfer a premises licence under section 42 of the Licensing Act 2003. **Appendix 2**
- 1.2 The premises is licensed for:
 - a) Supply of Alcohol (For consumption On/Off the premises)

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10.00 - 00.00 Monday - Wednesday (excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday)
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- 10.00 01.00 Thursday Saturday (excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday)
- 12.00 23.30 Sunday (excluding Christmas Day) and Good Friday
- 12.00 22.30 Christmas Day

b) Late Night Refreshment

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23.00 - 00.30 Monday - Wednesday (excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday)
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- 23.00 01.30 Thursday Saturday (excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday)
- 23.00 00.00 Sunday (excluding Christmas Day) and Good Friday

c) Recorded Music

Unless otherwise specified on this licence, no regulated entertainment, other than by way of music and singing only which is provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound, shall take place at the premises with the exception of pre-booked private events limited to the provision of music and dancing for pre-invited guests.

d) Opening hours

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10.00 - 00.30 Monday - Wednesday (excluding Christmas Day)
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10.00 - 01.30 Thursday - Saturday (excluding Christmas Day and Good Friday)

12.00 - 00.00 Sunday (excluding Christmas Day) and Good Friday

2. Representations

- 2.1 In accordance with Section 42 (6) of that Act, the Police may object to the Transfer where, in exceptional circumstances, they are satisfied that the transfer of the licence would undermine the crime prevention objective. In this case, such a notice has been received by the Licensing Authority, who must now hold a hearing to consider it.
- 2.2 A representation has been received against the application from the Police responsible authority.

The MPS is of the view that an application to transfer the premises licence was made after the licence has been revoked and is currently pending an appeal in the magistrate court. The MPS believes that the transferring the licence into a new

company with the same director, with all intention purposes is the same set of circumstances that led to the revocation in the first place

No sale or supply of alcohol

Monday to Thursday 09:00 until 23:30 Friday and Saturday 09:00 until midnight 09:00 until 22:30

3.4 The times for the framework hours on any given day are not (and should not be regarded as) the "usual" or "normal" working hours for licensable activities in the Borough. Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighbourhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.
