1. Application

1.1. This is an application to vary a premises licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. Appendix 2

1.2. The premises are licensed for:

a) Retail of Alcohol (For consumption on the premises)

10:00 – 22:30 Monday to Thursday

10:00 – 00:00 Friday and Saturday

11:00 – 22:30 Sunday

b) Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of Dance and Anything of a similar description to Live music, recorded music or performances of dance (Basement only)

15:00 - 22:30 Thursday

15:00 - 00:00 Friday and Saturday

c) Late Night Refreshment (Ground floor and Basement only)

23:00- 00:00 Friday and Saturday

d) Opening hours

Unrestricted

1.3. The Variation application is for:

a) To extend the licenced area by adding the premises located on 44 Birchington Road, London NW6 4LJ (next door) to the Restaurant (located on 46 Birchington Road, London NW6 4LJ).

b) Change licensing hours

Supply of alcohol (ON the premises)

10:00 – 22:30 – Monday to Sunday

Live Music

23:00 – 00:00 – Friday to Saturday

Recorded Music

23:00 – 00:00 – Friday to Saturday

Opening hours

09:00 - 23:00 – Monday to Sunday

c) Remove licensable activity:

- Late night refreshment

2. Representations

- 2.1. Four relevant representations were received in relation to the application.
- 2.2. The representations oppose the application, and are from the Environmental Health responsible authority and three residents including a resident petition **Appendix 4**
- 2.3. Following communication with Environmental Health the application has been amended to include conditions agreed with the Environmental Health. The agreed conditions now form part of the application and can be found at Appendix 4

- 3.2. The hours policy is not engaged by this application in relation to the proposed end times for the sale of alcohol. The framework hours are given in the policy as:
- 3.3. For licences including the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises only:

Supply of alcohol

Monday to Thursday	08:00 am until 23:30 pm
Friday and Saturday	08:00 am until 00:30 am
Sunday	10:00 am until 23:00 pm

- 3.4. The times for the framework hours on any given day are not (and should not be regarded as) the “usual” or “normal” working hours for licensable activities in the Borough. Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighbourhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.

- c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

5.3. Members may attach additional conditions if they consider it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives raised in the representations.

5.4. Members are reminded that all applications must be considered on their own merits, and that findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
