Proposed Conditions for Dirty Crunch, 290 Lower Addisombe Road, Croydon CR07AE

1. A CCTV system will be installed at the premises covering the entrance and all internal areas where alcohol is displayed. A head and shoulders image to identification standard shall be captured of every person entering the premises. Images shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days and supplied to the police or local authority on reasonable request.
2. A member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system must be available at the premises at all times in order to show officers or local authority recordings where needed. A takeaway copy provided on suitable digital media will be available within 48hrs if required.
3. The CCTV system will display, on screen and on any recording, the correct time and date that images were captured.
4. CCTV signage will be displayed, reminding customers that CCTV is in operation.
5. Staff must be given training in relation to Licensing Act 2003, conflict management and the protection of children from harm. Refresher training shall be given every 6 months and records shall be kept at the premises and made available for inspection by the police or authorised official from the local authority
6. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to the Police or an authorised officer of the London Borough of Croydon. The log will record the following:
 - Date of the incident
 - Time of the incident
 - Location of the incident
 - Persons concerned in the incident
 - Summary of incident
 - Identification of emergency personnel concerned where possible
 - All crimes reported to the venue
 - All ejections of customers or refusal of entry
 - Any incidents of disorder (disturbance caused by either one person or a group of people).
7. A challenge 25 policy will be in operation at the premises with operate signage on display throughout the premises.

8. The premises will have a refusal book or electronic system to record all refusals of sales, this must be made available to the police and local authority officers upon reasonable request.
9. No Beer, Lager, Cider or Perry is stocked, exposed for sale or sold that exceeds 6% ABV with the exception of genuine premium craft/artisan products.
10. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed at the exit to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.
11. The premises will adopt a no vertical drinking policy, therefore all alcohol drink purchases will be consumed whilst seated and be subject to table service.

Due to premises being close proximity to residential properties, the Pollution team is minded to require mitigation measures and conditions to the licence to address any potential noise impact on local residents.

Conditions/Restrictions

This will be a format which will be easily embedded and enforceable if there are future problems.

1. The licensee will ensure that recorded/live music ceased at 2300 hours.
2. The licensee will ensure that there is no external music played at the premises. Any music is restricted to indoors only.
3. The licensee will ensure that doors and windows are kept closed during events involving recorded/live music,
4. The licensee will ensure that patrons are managed to ensure that noise from exiting and entering is kept to minimum. Signage be displayed to leave quietly.
5. The licensee will ensure that there is close and regular liaison with the landlords and residents within close proximity of the premises to address complaints and concerns.
6. The licensee will ensure that no noise nuisance be caused to local residents from any activity associated with the premises licence

I write to object to the Application for premises Licence by the Applicant Dirty Crunch for the occupation of the premises 290 Lower Addiscombe Road, Croydon, CR0 7AE

My objections are:

The suitability of the proposed change of the premises from Retail/ Domestic to Retail/Entertainment. The proposed change to what is essentially a club will generate a significant increase in traffic and noise level, seven days a week, which is not in keeping with mainly a residential area.

Addiscombe is at present struggling with limited parking. I fear that the area cannot support the extra parking that will be necessary for the new premises. I can foresee issues with illegal parking and associated problems. I also fear the confrontation that may result should resident objects to blocked drives etc. I believe the premise has also applied for to hold an extensive alcohol licence.

I strongly believe that an entertainment club operating seven days a week with live music and the associated noise until 23,00 hours is best suited to less residential areas

On a lesser note, I also question what type of clientele will be attracted to an entertainment club with a name such as Dirty Crunch. It is a concern.

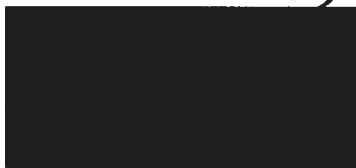
I am writing this to bring to your notice my objection to the proposed licensing application for a club or entertainment area at 290 Lower Addiscombe Road. My main objections are listed below:

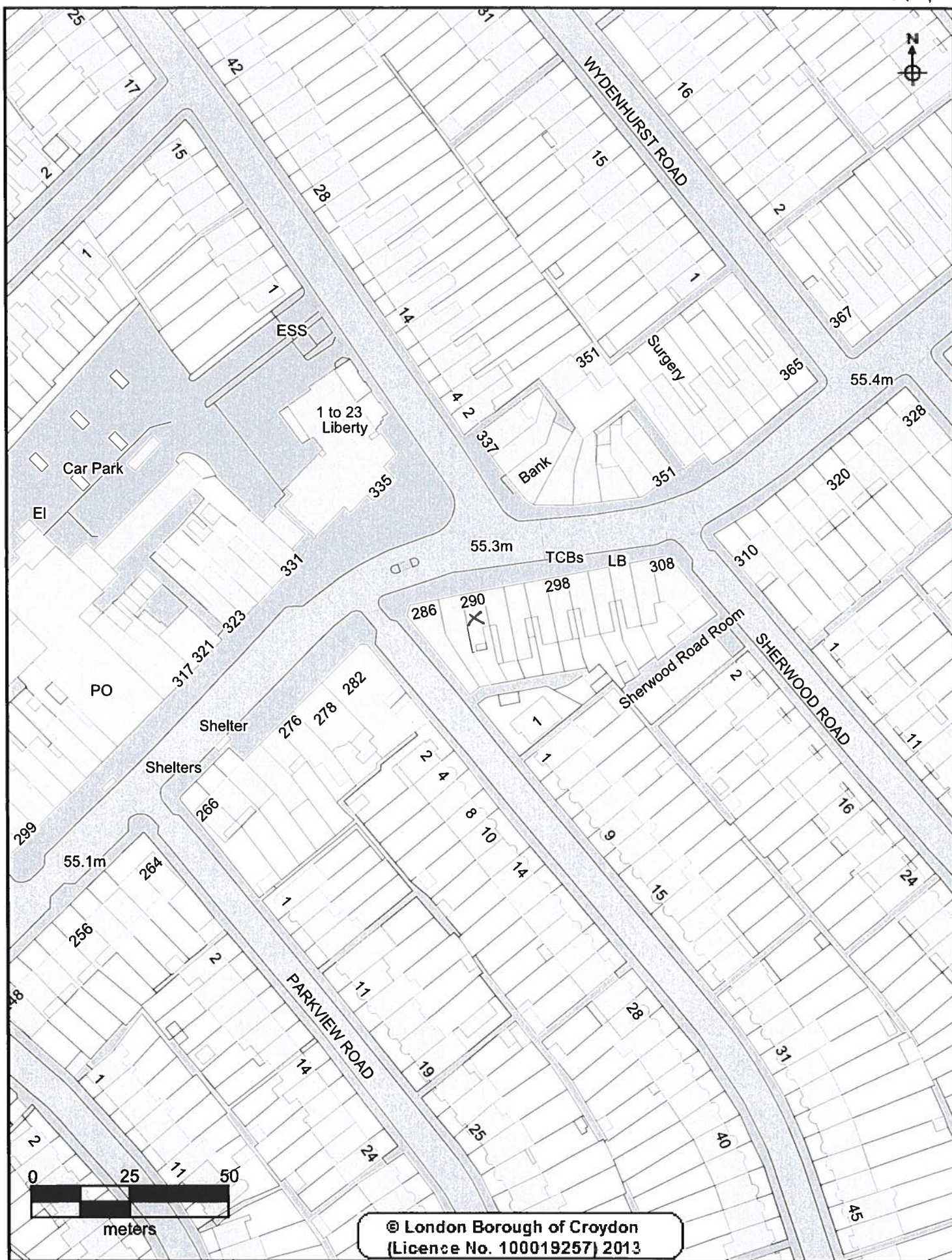
- Change of use from RETAIL/DOMESTIC to Retail/Entertainment
