1. Background

- 1.1. HWBs are a formal statutory committee of the local authority, tasked with providing a forum where political, clinical, professional and community leaders from across the health and care system come together to improve the health and wellbeing of their local population and reduce health inequalities.
- 1.2. As well as assessing the health and wellbeing needs of their population and publishing a joint strategic needs assessment (JSNA), HWBs have been responsible for publishing a joint local health and wellbeing strategy (JLHWS).
- 1.3. The JLHWS sets out priorities for improving the health and wellbeing of its local population and how the identified needs will be addressed, including addressing health inequalities, and which reflects the evidence of [the JSNA](#)

2. Key facts and/or data

- 2.1. Hackney's JLHWS was developed in 2021- 2022, based on four sources of input:
 - 2.1.1. A review of population health needs, which mapped local existing strategies and plans related to the [King's Fund 'population health' framework](#) areas of focus (wider determinants of health, integrated health and care system, health behaviours and lifestyles, places and communities we live in, and with).
 - 2.1.2. A workshop with the King's Fund in May 2021
 - 2.1.3. Engagement with residents and other stakeholders including a residents' survey and the recruitment and training of volunteer peer researchers to conduct surveys and focus groups;
 - 2.1.4. A formal 12 week consultation period to receive feedback from residents and wider stakeholders on the draft strategy

3. Prioritisation

- 3.1. Volunteer Centre Hackney (VCH) developed a peer research model and helped a team of over 40 peer researchers conduct 324 interviews as part of a wider engagement plan to help define the strategy priorities
- 3.2. A shortlist was identified by analysing the themes raised during the engagement phase, with the following areas chosen:
 - 3.2.1. improving mental health;
 - 3.2.2. increasing social connection; and
 - 3.2.3. supporting greater financial security.
