6(a) Councillor William Gill to the Cabinet Member for Health and Adult Social Care

Will the cabinet member recognise the success of the local initiative at Wednesbury arts museum in relation to Men's mental health and commit to working with the Health and Social Care board to help establish similar groups in every town within the next 6 months to ensure that all residents of this borough have an equal opportunity to ensure that their issues are heard and a platform to raise them?

(b) Councillor Trumpter to the Cabinet Member for Communities

Last year we collected more than 200 signatures on a petition to save our community centre on Beaconview Road. This was after the property was listed in the Black Country Plan for demolition and to be replaced with just one unit.

A group of residents from Charlemont with Grove Vale have since started a management committee, which has the full backing of Cllr Fisher and myself.
