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1 Recommendations

1.1 To consider and comment upon the draft Sandwell Winter Booklet for 2024.

2 Reasons for Recommendations

2.2 Sandwell Council, in collaboration with the Integrated Care Board, has developed a booklet to support residents through the winter months. This contains vital health, safety, and service information, including potentially lifesaving advice and support.

4 Context and Key Issues

Background

- 4.1 The rising costs of fuel, food, and other essentials have created financial hardships for many households, leading to increased vulnerability and reduced wellbeing within Sandwell. To mitigate the impact of the cost of living increases, Sandwell Council, in collaboration with the Integrated Care Board, has developed a booklet containing vital health, safety, and service information, including potentially lifesaving advice and support. As colder weather during the winter months exacerbates the situation, it is crucial to provide this information to all homes and care facilities, especially to those who may not have access to online resources.
- 4.2 The Sandwell Winter Booklet is an annual, universal resource, with physical copies distributed to all residents and an online version that includes links to translated versions and an accessible PDF. No printed newspaper (other than the three-times-a-year Sandwell Herald) goes to more than 20% of homes in Sandwell; the booklet will go to all homes (100%) in the borough as well as care homes, plus a number of public buildings. This is approximately 134,000 homes and approx. 2,000 care home residents, plus 500 copies for public buildings.
