1. Executive Summary

- 1.1 The attached annual update outlines work undertaken by Sandwell Council's scrutiny function in 2024-2025 and highlights a number of activities and outcomes that contributed towards the objectives of the Council Plan.
- 1.2 Scrutiny boards delivered the work programme using a variety of methodologies outlined in the update. Evidence was provided by a range of witnesses from the Council and partner organisations, and there was engagement with service users and providers.
