# Frimley Health and Care



The Slough Health and Wellbeing Board members are working together on developing a joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy 2026-2036, led by Slough's Public Health Team.

This will include a focus on reducing inequalities and increasing Healthy Life Expectancy. The new strategy will be published and aligned with the new NHS 10 year Long Term Plan.

The Health and Care Partnership Board (also known as the 'Place Board') are refreshing their Terms of Reference and developing a joint Place Delivery Plan for 2025-2026 led by the ICB.

This will include a focus on integration, partnership working and community-centred approaches to health and care.

Both the new joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy and the local Place Plan for 2025-2026 will be informed by the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment, population health profiles and Frimley's Connected Care patient insights platform as well as local insights from the community and partner's priorities.

In future, the ambition is for the annual plans to align as one delivery plan for partners to work on together and to refresh these together each year.





NHS staff are working harder than ever to get services back on track, to get waiting lists down and consistently deliver the best care.

We know change is needed. But we also know that many of the solutions we need are already here, working somewhere in the NHS today.

Whether you have a little to say or a lot, your views, experiences and ideas will shape immediate steps and long-term changes: a new 10-Year Health Plan for the NHS.

This is a once in a generation opportunity to set the NHS on a path for the future. Together we can fix it. We need your voice.



Since the launch of the Reconnect, Reset, Rebuild programme in November we have seen fantastic progress so far, including:

**150** 

individuals have actively contributed across 15 dynamic stakeholder sessions, bringing diverse insights and perspectives to the table.

*50*+

organisations from across our Integrated Care System have engaged in these sessions, demonstrating a strong collective commitment to shaping the future of health and care.

1000

people will be involved in conversations about their wellbeing and the future of health and care services thanks to funding that is supporting 20 community, charity, and voluntary sector organisations to connect with our local communities.



## Reconnect • Reset • Rebuild



- Four stakeholder sessions were held in Slough
- Eight community conversations funded that involve Slough residents directly including...

<u>Thames Valley Positive Support</u>, are an East Berkshire Charity supporting people living with HIV and people from the LGBTQIA+ community. Their work will involve carrying out four focus groups to capture feedback and insights from their community.





<u>Together As One</u> (Aik Saath), based in Slough, will be delivering a young person's health summit designed to amplify the voices of over 30 young individuals from diverse backgrounds.

Established in 1997, <u>Slough Refugee Support</u> (SRS) is committed to impartially assisting refugees and asylum seekers in Slough and in the surrounding areas. SRS will be delivering a series of five weekly one-hour long coffee morning sessions for their clients to capture their insights.





<u>Sakoon through Cancer</u> supports South Asian Women who have had a cancer diagnosis or are carers. Using a wide range of methods including visual story telling, photo journals and art techniques, the group will be capturing the views, experiences and perspectives of their members.
