We have received a request to vary the current Hackney Carriage fare which came into effect 09 November 2022.

A full copy of the current fare chart is attached for your information however for ease of reference we have calculated the fare for a 2-mile journey.

- November 2022 = £6.80
- Proposed increase = £7.20

We are consulting with all Hackney Carriage proprietors, the taxi meter calibration providers, Slough Taxi Federation, Slough Taxi Association, SBC Diversity and Inclusion manager and SBC Trading Standards. The consultation is to find out if the majority want to change the current tariff. Changing the tariff requires approval from the Licensing Committee.
