



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
1. How useful was the early communication about Conference?


2. How easy was it to book the Conference?


3. How informative were the Conference documents?

Larger venue made networking easier



Key points of support which sounded somewhat like an Agreed Syllabus introduction!


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That steps are being taken to move forward to SACRES and increase the profile and monitoring of RE in schools

Challenging thinking, especially around language and communities

Commonality - not identity boxes that divide us

The importance of socio/economic conditions are to building community.

Commonality should be central to the teaching of worldviews

RE is undervalued and under resourced but has great value and can focus on commonality, foster deep thinking and can be an antidote to generalisation and stereotyping and can help develop spirituality.

I am still digesting it. I agreed with many things she said, but found parts of it very concerning (Judeo-Christian is a kind of whiteness?!!) and she seemed to be scoring political points and pushing a particular agenda.

Some good ideas that I can 'feed' into the current review of our locally agreed syllabus.

The importance of Religion and worldviews in young people's education as intercultural navigators.

Insight into what the curriculum content for RE should be in the future

So much - I need time to digest what she said and hope her speech transcript will be available.

That what we are aiming for in Staffordshire is in line with her thinking

The complexities of worldviews - which in my naivety I thought would be an uncontested aspect. Her views aligned with my own and made me feel included in a community that I often feel an outsider in.

A reminder that spirituality was a key recommendation from CoRE

I thought the talk was ideologically driven by a Worldviews agenda and insensitive to the teaching of religion per se. This was exposed in her words about spirituality which was a Buddhist understanding showing little knowledge or appreciation of how this term is understood within Christianity, Judaism and Islam and her thoroughly unempathetic response to a question from a Jewish participant.

A more enhanced understanding of the sensitivities between cultural groups and the vast, vast numbers of groups that there are and hence identities.

Thought provoking outline of the journey of RE to RVE and the subject's future. Consideration of the negative outcomes of positive input with reference to Islamophobia and black history week.


Boosted confidence that syllabus being planned for strong RE






15. Overall, including the June workshops, how would you rate our 2025 Conference as value for money?
