ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

AUTHORISATION OF ALCOHOL

FILL IN BY

The supply or sale of alcohol is prohibited when:

- (a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence
- (b) at a times when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence has been suspended

In addition every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

Condition 1, with effect from 1st October 2014

- 1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamourise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Condition 2, with effect from 1st October 2014

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 3, with effect from 1st October 2014

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at

the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Condition 4, with effect from 1st October 2014

The responsible person must ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

With effect from 28th May 2014 the following mandatory condition applies:

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1- 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula where-

- P is the permitted price,
- D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

- the holder of the premises licence,
- the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a Club Premises Certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question and 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) 1. Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ('the first day') would be different from the permitted price on the next day ('the second day') as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

2. The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

General - all four licensing objectives

1. Challenge 25 policy to be in place at all times
2. CCTV to be installed and 31 days recording system staff trained to download images when required
3. All staff to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing
4. Training manual will be available at the premises

The prevention of crime and disorder

5. The premise license holder shall ensure that CCTV camera and recorders are installed at the premises and are of a standard acceptable to and approved by the Police
6. The system shall be maintained in good working order and at all times the premise is open to the public, be fully operational covering both internal and external areas of the premises to which the public have access. All images should be stored for a minimum of 31 days
7. The CCTV views are not to be obstructed, at least one CCTV camera is to be placed near to the exit in order to capture clear facial images of all patrons leaving the premises
8. Signage will be prominently displayed advising customers that they are being filmed on CCTV
9. DPS or nominated person to be trained on how to work the CCTV system to the standard where the nominated person can download any potential evidence required by Thames Valley Police employees and Authorised persons as defined by Sections 13 & 69 Licensing Act 2003 (Amended condition following a minor variation on 7th July 2022)
10. All alcohol shall be purchased from AWRS registered cash & carry and wholesalers.
11. Incident register to be in place and kept up to date and made available upon request of the Thames Valley Police and authorised Licensing officers and be kept for a minimum of one year. (Amended condition following a minor variation on 7th July 2022)
12. All staff will have right to work in UK documents checked before being offered employment.

Public safety

13. Installation of appropriate safety equipment
14. CCTV working at all times
15. DPS or nominated person is responsible in supplying the necessary media (discs, data stick) containing any downloaded content.
16. DPS or nominated person is an active member of the Local Pub Watch scheme when in existence.

The prevention of public nuisance

17. Notice displayed asking customers to leave quietly from premises also customers will be told in person to leave quietly and not to disturb the local neighbourhood
18. Strict policy in place to tell all staff not to serve alcohol to drunks at all
19. Appropriate signage will be displayed, in prominent position informing customers they are being recorded on CCTV

The protection of children from harm

20. A 'Challenge 25' policy will be in force, where any person looking under the age of 25 shall be asked to prove their age when attempting to purchase alcohol and signs to this effect will be displayed at the premises. Challenge 25 posters displayed where alcohol is sold.
21. The only acceptable ID will be those with photographic identification documents; including passport, photo-card, driving license or proof of age card bearing the PASS hologram.
22. A refusal book shall be kept at the premises and updated as and when required, and made available for inspection on request to an Licensing Officers, Police or other responsible authority.

23. The licensee will ensure that staff are trained regularly as appropriate in respect to the Licensing Act 2003 legislation, staff to be trained regularly in underage sales prevention.

24. All staff authorised to sell alcohol will be trained in the Challenge 25 scheme and this training will be documented to include the date the training was given, the name of the person who gave the training, the person who received the training and signatures by both trainer and trainee..

Additional Conditions following a minor variation on 7th July 22

25. Personal Licence Holder to be on site from 5pm till close every day. Minimum of 2 x SIA door staff to be on duty on a Friday and Saturday evening from 8pm until close and at any other time as advised by Thames Valley Police or the Local Authority. Door Staff to be wearing high visibility jackets.

26. Whilst SIA Security Personnel are employed at the premises all will be deployed with digitally recording Body Worn Video (BWV). The BWV will be used to record any incidents which occur inside or outside of the premises involving customers, prospective customers or any staff member that impact on any of the four licensing objectives.

27. Data recordings shall be made immediately available to an authorised officer of Thames Valley Police or an authorised Licensing Officer from the Local Authority together with facilities for viewing upon request, subject to the provisions of the Data Protection Act.

28. Door staff signing in and out register to be in place and made available upon the request of Thames Valley Police and authorised Licensing officers and be kept for a minimum of one year.

29. Any garden furniture to be removed at 10pm each day of the week.
