Summary

- 1. This item seeks the Committee's consideration of the proposed removal of epicormic/stem growth to a height of 5m and removal of deadwood throughout for 1 no. oak tree as part of tree management; specifically, removal of epicormics will allow ongoing monitoring of the worsening of the trunk cavity, and further delamination of the bark.
- 2. This tree is situated within the rear yard of 24 Blythwood Gardens, Stansted. A District Councillor has an interest in the property.
