Summary

1. The Modern Slavery Act 2015 is an Act of Parliament and is designed to combat modern slavery and equip law enforcement to fight this, it imposes severe penalties on perpetrators and enhances the support available for victims.

- 2. The bill was introduced to the House of Commons in October 2013 and received royal assent and became law on the 26 March 2015. Further amendments have been introduced to the original bill, with one relating to 'Transparency in Supply Chain Provisions', which sets out specific legislative requirements relating to the purchase of goods and services.
- 3. The legislation requires that businesses and organisations with an annual turnover of more than £36 million publish an annual Modern Slavery Statement, which sets out the steps the business or organisation has made to ensure that these practices are not happening within their supply chains.
- 4. Uttlesford District Council as a public sector organisation, an employer and a community leader is committed to undertaking a preventative approach to modern slavery and human trafficking within its corporate responsibilities and activities.
- 5. The publication of this Annual Statement is part of that commitment and highlights the activities undertaken to address this and the steps taken to ensure the council's supply chains are free of this.

Recommendations

6. The Cabinet are requested to approve the Modern Slavery Statement for the year 2025/26, as set out in Appendix A.
