Human Rights/Legal Implications	The Bribery Act 2010 was introduced to update and enhance English law on bribery. It creates a strict liability corporate criminal offence of failing to prevent bribery. The only defence against this corporate offence is for organisations to have adequate procedures in place to prevent bribery

8. The policy provides a clear statement of the Council's position and response to bribery activity.
