The premises comprise a two-storey restaurant operating under a *farm-to-fork* concept, with all ingredients sourced from local farms and producers. The building includes a ground-floor dining area, kitchen and preparation areas, and a first-floor space for additional seating and staff facilities.

The restaurant provides freshly prepared meals for consumption on the premises, alongside a small takeaway service offering hot and cold food prepared to order.

The premises are fitted with suitable fire safety systems, secure waste storage, and a dedicated area for deliveries and goods handling. Alcohol sales will be ancillary to the provision of food, and the venue will operate primarily as a restaurant.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The premises will be operated in a responsible and professional manner with the primary focus on providing high-quality meals and a safe, enjoyable dining experience. Alcohol sales will be ancillary to food service, and the management will ensure that all staff are trained in their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003.

Comprehensive operating procedures will be in place covering staff training, incident management, and regular safety checks to uphold all four licensing objectives:

The prevention of crime and disorder
Public safety
The prevention of public nuisance
The protection of children from harm

All staff will receive induction and refresher training on these principles, with records maintained and available for inspection by responsible authorities. The premises will work in cooperation with local authorities, police, and community safety partnerships to ensure ongoing compliance and excellence in this area.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will operate at all times with footage kept for 31 days. Staff will challenge disorderly behaviour and refuse service to intoxicated persons. A zero-tolerance policy toward drugs or antisocial conduct will be enforced.

c) Public safety

All fire safety equipment will be maintained and regularly tested. Exits will be kept clear, and capacity limits observed. Staff will be trained in emergency procedures and first aid availability.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Signage will remind customers to leave quietly. Waste will be managed to avoid odour and disturbance. Music levels will be kept low and windows/doors closed during evening hours to minimise noise.

e) The protection of children from harm

Challenge 25 policy will be in place for alcohol sales. Children will be supervised at all times, and no alcohol will be served without a responsible adult present. Staff will receive safeguarding training.

 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- **Dance:** no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- **Cross activity exemptions:** no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
