Committee remit

- 1.1. The coordinating committee will maintain oversight of scrutiny committee work plans (although committees should continue to set their own work plans)
- 1.2. The committee will coordinate the annual report to Council on the activity, impact and effectiveness of scrutiny against its terms of reference and Council objectives.
- 1.3. The committee will monitor the Cabinet forward plan and recommend scrutiny of upcoming decisions to individual committees where not already included in work plans.
- 1.4. The committee will commission time-limited informal groups to undertake scrutiny of cross-cutting issues in a similar manner to themed reviews, receive recommendations or reports from those groups and make recommendations to Cabinet or Council.
- 1.5. The committee will also be responsible for scrutiny of:
