

Easy Read




This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.

About this booklet



This booklet is from Waltham Forest Borough Council.

We provide services to people across the Borough, including **adult social care services**.



Adult social care services provide extra support to people at home and in the local community.



We want to change the way we work out how much people pay towards the adult social care services they use.



Before we make a decision, we want to know what you think.

Please read this booklet and answer the questions before Wednesday, 13 August 2025.

Working out what people pay towards their care now



The council works out how much people can afford to pay towards their adult social care.



We have to make sure people are left with enough money for the basic things they need to live, like food and bills.



This amount of money is called the **minimum income guarantee**, or **MIG** for short.



The government sets this amount. It depends on things like your age, disability, and whether you are single or in a couple.

What happens now



At the moment, the council adds an extra 25% on top of the government's minimum income guarantee.



This means people are allowed to keep more of their money before paying towards their adult social care.



For example, if you are a single adult aged between 18 to 24, the government says you need a minimum of £89.15 per week.



Adults up to 65 years old can also get an extra £49.65 added on top of this.

This extra amount is called a disability premium. It is to help pay for things some adults need because of a disability, health condition or long-term illness.



We then add an extra 25% on top of the minimum amount and disability premium, which is £34.70.



This means you would keep £173.50 per week before paying anything towards your adult social care.

The change we are suggesting



The council is thinking about removing the extra 25% we add on, in 2 steps:

• From late 2025 - reduce the extra amount from 25% to 10%.



• From late 2026 - remove the extra amount completely.



We are not changing the government's minimum income guarantee.



We are not changing any benefits you get, like extra money you get to support you with a disability.

Why we are suggesting the change



Like many other councils, Waltham Forest Borough Council has less money than it used to.



We need to save at least £25 million over the next 3 years to keep our services running.



We are one of the few councils that add extra on to the government's minimum income guarantee.



If we reduce the extra we add on completely, like most other councils, it could help to save about £1 million every year.

• From late 2025 - reduce the extra amount from 25% to 10%.




• From late 2026 - remove the extra amount completely.




